



INSIGHTS - MATCHDAY 34

SERIE A 2025/2026



It had not been since 2021/22 that the gap between 4th and 5th place in the table after matchday 33 was this wide: on that occasion too, the sides involved were Juventus (63 points) and Roma (58). The Bianconeri went on to confirm their 4th-place finish with 70 points.

Inter have their first opportunity to win the Scudetto: should the Nerazzurri beat Torino, they would clinch the title if Napoli and Milan both fail to win. Inter would thus be crowned Champions of Italy at the end of matchday 34, as in the 2020/21 season, when victory against Crotona took them 13 points clear of their closest pursuers. Napoli in 2022/23 and Inter themselves in 2023/24 went one better, clinching the title mathematically at the end of matchday 33.

Last chance for Pisa and Verona: at the end of matchday 34 of the 2025/26 Serie A season, both sides could be mathematically relegated to Serie B. This would happen should Pisa lose at Parma and Lecce beat Verona.



NAPOLI



CREMONESE

Napoli are unbeaten in 15 home matches (Diego Armando Maradona Stadium) against Cremonese: 12 wins (last 3-0, Serie A 2022/23) and 3 draws (last 2-2 after extra time, 4-5 on penalties, Coppa Italia 2022/23).

Counting the Coppa Italia 2022/23 penalty shootout win as a draw over 90 minutes, **Cremonese are on an 11-match winless run in all competitions against Napoli** (home and away). Their last victory dates back to 11 September 1994 (Cremonese-Napoli 2-0, Serie A).

Among current squad players, **the top scorer in this fixture (at the Maradona and Zini) is Rasmus Hojlund, with 2 goals** (both scored in the reverse fixture).

Napoli failed to score in the last Serie A round, ending a streak of 10 consecutive matches with a goal (last blank was Juventus-Napoli 3-0, 25 January 2026).

Napoli are coming off a home defeat to Lazio, which ended a run of 26 consecutive unbeaten home matches (19 wins, 7 draws). Their previous home loss was on 8 December 2024 (Napoli-Lazio 0-1).

Only Inter (41) **have collected more home points than Napoli (37) in Serie A 2025/26.**

Only Roma (53) **average more ball recoveries than Napoli (51.1) in Serie A 2025/26.**

Only Inter (23) and Genoa (16) **have scored more set-piece goals than Napoli (15) this season.**

Napoli are the team with the most different scorers in Serie A 2025/26 (19 players).

Napoli are the side that have conceded the most penalties in the league (9).

Only Juventus (42) **have received fewer yellow cards than Napoli (43) this season.**

Only Lecce (11) **have lost more away matches than Cremonese (10, level with Verona) in Serie A 2025/26.**

Only Pisa (58.4) and Lecce (57.4) **have conceded more expected goals (xG) than Cremonese (57) this season.**

This is the 4th official meeting between Antonio Conte and Marco Giampaolo: the Napoli head coach has won all 3 previous encounters.



NAPOLI



CREMONESE

Considering the 5 major European leagues, **Vanja Milinković-Savić is the goalkeeper who has saved the most penalties (3)** in the current season.

Only Arijanet Murić (118) **makes more saves than Emil Audero (114)** in the 2025/26 Serie A season.



PARMA



PISA

The head-to-head record between the two sides in Emilia stands at 19 meetings: 8 Ducali wins (the most recent 3-2, Serie B 2023/24), 6 draws (the most recent 1-1, Serie B 2021/22) and 5 Tuscan victories (the most recent 0-1, Serie B 2022/23).

The only Serie A meeting between the two sides to date dates back to 24 March 1991: a 2-3 away win for Pisa, with a Padovano brace and a Neri goal for the Tuscans, while Brolin and Melli from the penalty spot replied for the hosts. That match remains to this day the last away victory in Pisa's top-flight history.

Parma have collected 16 points in their last 10 matchdays: 4 wins, 4 draws and 2 defeats. More broadly, since the club's bankruptcy in 2015 and subsequent rebirth, only in the 2019/20 season (40 points) has Parma performed better than this season after 33 matchdays (39).

Parma are the 2025/26 Serie A side that has benefited from the most opposition red cards (7).

Parma are one of 3 sides in the 2025/26 Serie A season with the fewest penalties awarded in their favour (2), level with Cagliari and Lecce.

The second and fourth lowest-scoring sides in the 2025/26 Serie A season go head-to-head: Pisa have scored 23 goals (level with Verona), Parma 24.

Pisa are on a run of 4 consecutive defeats: 11 goals conceded in that period. Their last positive result was the 3-1 home win over Cagliari on 15 March.

Pisa are the 2025/26 Serie A side that concedes the most goals (58).

Pisa are the 2025/26 Serie A side that concedes the most goals from opposition substitutes (11, level with Lecce and Verona).

This is the first official meeting between Carlos Cuesta and Oscar Hiljemark.

Only Victor Nelsson (143) and Thiago Gabriel (138) have **won more aerial duels than Idrissa Touré (132) and Simone Canestrelli (118) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.**

Mateo Pellegrino (487) is the player who contests the most duels in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Nesta Elphége on the scoresheet against Udinese: the Parma striker's first Serie A goal – and the first top-flight goal of his career.



BOLOGNA



ROMA

There have been 81 official matches between the two sides in Emilia, with the record standing at 34 wins for Bologna (most recent: 2-0, Serie A 2023/24), 25 draws (most recent: 1-1, Europa League 2025/26) and 22 wins for Roma (most recent: 1-5, Serie A 2020/21).

After three consecutive wins, **Bologna have recorded three draws and one defeat in their last four encounters against the Giallorossi.**

Roma have not won away from home in seven competitive matches. Their last away win was a 2-0 victory in Turin in Serie A on 18 January.

Looking solely at home matches, Bologna sit 13th in the table with 20 points from 16 games, comprising 6 wins, 2 draws and 8 defeats. In the 2024/25 season, the Bolognese suffered just 2 home defeats throughout the campaign, achieving the 6th-best home record in Serie A.

Bologna are the 2025/26 Serie A side who have made the most substitutions (164 out of 165 available).

Bologna have scored 42 goals after 33 matchdays: over the last five seasons, to find a lower tally, one must go back to the 2021/22 season (37 goals scored).

Roma have conceded 29 goals after 33 matchdays: to find a better record, one must go back to the 2017/18 season (27 goals conceded).

Roma are the Serie A side that have conceded the fewest goals in the first halves (10).

Roma are the team in the 2025/26 Serie A season that have conceded the fewest penalties (1).

This is the 18th official meeting between Vincenzo Italiano and Gian Piero Gasperini: in the previous 17, Italiano has won 8, Gasperini 5, and there have been 4 draws.

Riccardo Orsolini is the player in the 2025/26 Serie A season who has hit the woodwork the most (6).

Evan Ndicka is the player in Serie A 2025/26 who has won back the most balls (239).

Only Mateo Pellegrino (74) has committed more fouls than Gianluca Mancini (63, the same as Marin Pongracic) in Serie A 2025/26.



The official head-to-head record between the two sides in Verona stands at 24 meetings: 12 Scaligeri wins (the most recent 2-0, Serie A 2022/23), 9 draws (the most recent 1-1, Serie A 2024/25) and 3 Salento victories (the most recent 0-2, Serie B 2018/19).

Lecce's very first Serie A match was played in Verona on 8 September 1985, a 2-2 draw with goals from Elkjaer and Di Gennaro for the home side, and Nobile and Paciocco for the Salentini.

Verona are the 2025/26 Serie A side with the fewest different goalscorers (10, level with Torino).

Verona have lost 8 of their last 9 Serie A matchdays. Their only positive result in that run came on 8 March 2026 (Bologna 1-2 Verona, Serie A 2025/26).

Verona are the 2025/26 Serie A side that receives the most yellow cards (73, level with Fiorentina).

Verona have not won at home since 6 December 2025 (Verona 3-1 Atalanta, Serie A). In the subsequent 9 home matches, 1 draw and 8 defeats. Verona have gone 296 minutes without scoring at home. Their last goal was scored by Akpa Akpro in the 64th minute of Verona 1-2 Napoli on 28 February 2026.

The two lowest-scoring sides in the 2025/26 Serie A season go head-to-head: Verona (23) and Lecce (22).

Verona are the 2025/26 Serie A side that concedes the most shots from outside the penalty area per match (5.5).

Verona are the 2025/26 Serie A side that commits the most fouls per match (15.8).

Verona are the 2025/26 Serie A side that makes the most interceptions per match (37.6).

Verona are the side that scores the fewest goals through substitutes (2, level with Udinese).

Only Pisa (21.7) **win more aerial duels per match in the 2025/26 Serie A season than Verona** (21).

Only Pisa (13.9) **win more tackles per match in the 2025/26 Serie A season than Verona and Lecce** (13.6).



Lecce are the 2025/26 Serie A side that has taken the fewest penalties (2, level with Parma and Cagliari).

Two of the 3 sides in the 2025/26 Serie A season that concede the most goals from opposition substitutes go head-to-head (11, level with Pisa).

Lecce have drawn their last five matches. Their last win came on 8 March 2026 (Lecce 2-1 Cremonese, Serie A).

This is the first official meeting between Paolo Sammarco and Eusebio Di Francesco.

Eusebio Di Francesco, the former manager of the day: he managed the Verona side from July to September 2021, recording 1 win and 3 defeats in 4 official matches.

No player wins more duels in Serie A 2025/26 than Victor Nelsson (215).

No player wins more tackles in Serie A 2025/26 than Santiago Pierotti (72).

No player makes more attacking recoveries (91) in Serie A 2025/26 than Ylber Ramadani.

Only Arijanet Muric (79) **makes more saves from shots inside the penalty area in Serie A 2025/26 than Wladimiro Falcone (77).**

Amin Sarr (Verona) and Konan Ndri (Lecce) are two of the three players in Serie A 2025/26 who come on as substitutes most often during a match (22), along with Caleb Ekuban (Genoa).



FIorentINA



SASSUOLO

In the 12 previous meetings between the two sides in Florence, the record stands at 5 wins for the Viola (most recent 5-1, Serie A 2023/24), 4 draws (most recent 2-2, Serie A 2021/22) and 3 wins for the Neroverdi (most recent 1-3, Serie A 2019/20).

Fiorentina have won 3 of their last 10 matches against Sassuolo (at the Franchi and the Mapei Stadium): the Emiliani have 5 wins and 2 draws.

Fiorentina have recorded 4 consecutive positive results at home against Sassuolo: 2 wins and 2 draws, with 10 goals scored and 5 conceded.

Domenico Berardi is the top scorer in matches between Fiorentina and Sassuolo (at the Franchi and the Mapei Stadium) **with 10 goals.**

Fiorentina are the 2025/26 Serie A side who have dropped the most points from leading positions (24).

Fiorentina are coming off the back of six consecutive positive results in Serie A (three wins and three draws): this is their best run in this league.

Sassuolo are coming off the back of three consecutive matches with a 2-1 final score: wins against Como and Cagliari, a defeat against Genoa at Marassi.

Only Inter (13%) and Como (11.94%) **have a higher percentage of shots converted into goals than Sassuolo (11.87%) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.**

Sassuolo are the 2025/26 Serie A side who have conceded the most goals in the first 30 minutes of play (18).

Third official meeting between Paolo Vanoli and Fabio Grosso: in the two previous encounters, the Sassuolo manager has won both.

Only Evan Ndicka (239) **has made more recoveries than Marin Pongracic (224) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.**

Only Federico Dimarco (181) **has delivered more crosses from open play than Dodô (140) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.**

Jack Harrison scores against Lecce: the Viola forward's first goal in Italy. He had not scored in a competitive match since 8 March 2025 in Wolverhampton v Everton (1-2), Premier League.

**FIorentINA****SASSUOLO**

Cristian Volpato scores against Como: the Italian winger's second goal in this league. It is his second-best league campaign of his career, after scoring four goals in the 2024/25 Serie B season.

M'Bala Nzola on the scoresheet against Como: his 4th goal of the campaign for the Neroverdi striker, and his 1st in a Sassuolo shirt. He is the all-time top scorer among Angolan players in Serie A with 33 goals (a distant second place shared by Zito Luvumbo and Bastos, with 6).



GENOA



COMO

The official head-to-head record between the two sides in Genoa stands at 15 meetings: 8 Rossoblù wins (the most recent 2-1, Serie B 2001/02), 6 draws (the most recent 1-1, Serie A 2024/25) and 1 Como victory (0-1, Serie B 2003/04).

Genoa have collected 9 points in their last 5 Serie A matches: their best run of the season with 3 wins and 2 defeats (matched only by the period 03/01-25/01, with 2 wins and 3 draws). Their last defeat came on 06/04 (Juventus 2-0 Genoa). Genoa have gone without a draw since 15 February (Cremonese 0-0 Genoa). In the subsequent 8 matchdays, 4 wins and 4 defeats for the Grifone.

For the third consecutive year, Genoa sit on 39 points after 33 matchdays. To find a better return at this stage of the season in Serie A, you have to go back to 2015/16: 40 points from 33 matches.

Como have collected just 1 point in their last 3 Serie A matches: their longest winless run of the season. Como's last win came on 22/03 (Como 5-0 Pisa).

Como are 2 wins away from their all-time record for victories in a single Serie A season: they have claimed 16 so far, with the record standing at 18, set in 1950/51. Their all-time points record, however, has already been equalled (it would also have been 58 in the 1950/51 season, had a win been worth 3 points).

Genoa are the 2025/26 Serie A side that concedes the fewest goals between the 76th minute and the 90th minute, excluding stoppage time (1, level with Lazio).

The two sides that have taken the most penalties in the 2025/26 Serie A season meet at the Luigi Ferraris (9 for the Rossoblù, 7 for the Lariani, level with Milan and Pisa).

Only Inter (78) **have scored more goals than Como (57, level with Milan) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.**

Only Inter (13%) **have a better shot-to-goal conversion rate than Como (11.94%)** in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Only Roma (10) **have conceded fewer first-half goals than Como (12)** in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

This is the first official meeting between Daniele De Rossi and Cesc Fàbregas.



GENOA



COMO

Caleb Ekuban is the 2025/26 Serie A player who has come off the bench the most times (22, level with Amin Sarr and Konan N'Dri).

Lorenzo Colombo (25) is the player who has been substituted the most times in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Jeff Ekhator scored against Pisa: his third goal of the season. The Genoa striker hadn't scored since 29/12/2025 (Roma v Genoa 3-1).

Lorenzo Colombo scored against Pisa: his seventh goal in this Serie A campaign. The Genoa striker had not scored since 7 February 2026 (Genoa v Napoli, 2-3). This is his best season ever in terms of goals (surpassing the six he scored in 2021/22 with Spal in Serie B and in 2024/25 with Empoli in Serie A).

Nico Paz scored against Sassuolo: his 12th goal of the season. The Argentine has scored a total of three goals in his last four Serie A matches.



The official head-to-head record between the two sides in Turin stands at 90 meetings: 32 Granata wins (the most recent 1-0, Serie A 2018/19), 26 draws (the most recent 1-1, Serie A 2021/22) and 32 Nerazzurri victories (the most recent 0-2, Serie A 2024/25).

Torino have not beaten Inter at the Olimpico Grande Torino since 27 January 2019, a 1-0 Serie A win with a decisive goal from Izzo in the 35th minute.

Torino have gone without a home goal against Inter since 13 March 2022 (Torino 1-1 Inter, Serie A): Bremer scored for the Granata in the 12th minute. The drought stands at 348 minutes.

The Turin fixture brings together the 2025/26 Serie A **side that scores the most goals in the opening 15 minutes of the second half** (Inter, 14) **and the one that concedes the most in that same period** (Torino, 9, level with 6 other sides).

Torino are the 2025/26 Serie A side with the fewest different goalscorers (10, level with Verona).

Inter are the 2025/26 Serie A side that has scored the most goals (78), **12 of which have been scored by substitutes – more than any other side.**

Inter are on a run of 6 official matches without defeat: following the derby loss (Milan 1-0 Inter, 8 March), they have recorded 4 wins (including one in the Coppa Italia) and 2 draws, scoring a total of 17 goals and conceding 9.

Inter are the 2025/26 Serie A side that has kept the most clean sheets (16).

This is the 2nd official meeting between Roberto D'Aversa and Cristian Chivu: the current Granata manager won the previous encounter, Empoli 2-1 Parma in the 2024/25 Serie A season.

Since D'Aversa's arrival at matchday 27, Torino have collected 13 points in 7 matchdays, with 3 wins from 3 at home. **Only Inter (14), Napoli (16) and Juventus (17) have collected more points in that period.**

No player has delivered more crosses than Federico Dimarco (290) in the 2025/26 Serie A season – accounting for 31.2% of Inter's total crosses, as the Nerazzurri are the side that delivers the most crosses in the league (28.2 per match).



TORINO



INTER

Lautaro Martínez is the top scorer for both Inter and the 2025/26 Serie A season with 16 goals in total. No player has attempted more shots from inside the penalty area than Lautaro Martínez (75) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Piotr Zieliński and Hakan Çalhanoğlu (5 each) are the players who have scored the most goals from outside the box in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

No player has scored more goals from corners than Marcus Thuram (4) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

No player has made more forward passes in the attacking third than Nicolò Barella (228) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Federico Dimarco (16) and Nicolò Barella (8, alongside Armand Laurienté) are the players with the most assists in the 2025/26 Serie A season.



MILAN



JUVENTUS

There have been 103 previous official matches between the two sides in Milan, with the Rossoneri recording 33 wins (the most recent a 2-0 victory in the 2022/23 Serie A season), 42 draws (the most recent a 0-0 draw in last season's Serie A) and 28 Bianconeri victories (the most recent a 0-1 win in the 2023/24 Serie A season).

Milan have not scored at home against Juventus for 216 minutes: the last goal was scored by Brahim Diaz in the 54th minute of the 2-1 Milan v Juventus match on 8 October 2022, Serie A.

Milan are the Serie A 2025/26 side with the fewest goals conceded (27).

Milan are one of two teams in the 2025/26 Serie A season without a red card in their favour (along with Torino).

Milan are the 2025/26 Serie A team making the fewest substitutions (132 out of 165).

Milan are the 2025/26 Serie A team earning the most points from behind (14).

Milan are one of two teams in the 2025/26 Serie A season to concede the fewest goals in the second half (14, alongside Atalanta).

Juventus are coming off the back of 6 wins and 2 draws in their last 7 matches. 14 goals scored and 5 clean sheets during that period. Last defeat: 0-2 at home against Como on 21/02/2026.

Juventus have kept a clean sheet for 308 minutes: the last goal conceded was by Pinamonti in the 52nd minute of Juventus v Sassuolo (1-1) on 21/03/2026.

This marks the 16th official meeting between Massimiliano Allegri and Luciano Spalletti: the current Juventus manager leads 6-5 over Luciano Spalletti, with 4 draws completing the record.

Allegri, the former manager of the day: he managed Juventus from 2014/15 to 2018/19 and from 2021/22 to 2023/24, winning 12 titles, including 5 league titles, 2 Supercoppa Italiana titles (2015 and 2018) and 5 Coppa Italia titles (4 consecutive from 2014/15 to 2017/18 and in 2023/24). In black and white, he has managed 420 official matches, recording 271 wins, 77 draws and 72 defeats.

Only Federico Dimarco (78) **creates more chances than Kenan Yildiz (64) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.**



MILAN



Facing each other are the two players who complete the most forward passes in the 2025/26 Serie A season: Manuel Locatelli (1230) and Luka Modric (979).

Adrien Rabiot is a former player of today's opponents: he wore the Juventus shirt from 2019 to 2024, making 212 appearances and scoring 22 goals. With the Bianconeri he also won 1 league title (Serie A 2019/20), 2 Coppa Italia trophies (2020/21 and 2023/24) and 1 Supercoppa Italiana (2020/21).

Pierre Kalulu is a former player of today's opponents: he wore the Milan shirt from 2020 to 2024, making 112 appearances – the most at any club in his career – and scoring 3 goals. With the Rossoneri he won the only trophy of his career, the Serie A title in the 2021/22 season.

Manuel Locatelli is a former player of today's opponents: he came through the Rossoneri academy from 2009 to 2015, making his Serie A debut on 21 April 2016. With Milan he made 63 appearances and scored 2 goals, winning the Supercoppa Italiana in 2016/17.

Jonathan David on the scoresheet against Bologna: the Juventus striker's 6th league goal of the season (the top-scoring Canadian in Serie A history, level with Ismaël Koné). He had not scored in Serie A since 1 February 2026 in Parma 1-4 Juventus.

Khéphren Thuram on the scoresheet against Bologna: the French midfielder's 3rd goal of the campaign. He had not scored since 7 March in Juventus 4-0 Pisa.



CAGLIARI



ATALANTA

The official head-to-head record between the two sides in Sardinia stands at 42 meetings: 22 Rossoblù wins (the most recent 2-1, Serie A 2023/24), 9 draws (the most recent 1-1, Serie A 2012/13) and 11 Nerazzurri victories (the most recent 0-1, Serie A 2024/25).

Only Verona and Fiorentina (both 73) **have received more yellow cards than Cagliari (72, level with Sassuolo)** in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Cagliari are the 2025/26 Serie A side with the highest number of defensive recoveries per match (38.5).

Cagliari are one of 3 sides in the 2025/26 Serie A season that have taken the fewest penalties (2), level with Lecce and Parma.

Only Inter (72.5) and Juventus (64.1) produce more xG than Atalanta (60.7) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Only Bologna (80.7) and Cremonese (69.1) average more long passes per match than Atalanta (68.5) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Atalanta have suffered just one away defeat in their last 9 matchdays, with the remaining record standing at 4 wins and 4 draws. **Their last away loss was 1-2 at the Mapei Stadium against Sassuolo on 01/03/2026.**

This is the 2nd official meeting between Fabio Pisacane and Raffaele Palladino: the Atalanta manager won the first leg 2-1.

Only Emil Audero (44) makes more saves from shots outside the penalty area than Elia Caprile (37, level with Mile Svilar) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Marco Palestra is the 2025/26 Serie A player with the highest number of fouls suffered (105).

Only Kenan Yildiz (91) and Alexis Saelemaekers (78) complete more dribbles than Marco Palestra (77) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Charles De Ketelaere is the 2025/26 Serie A midfielder with the most touches in the opposition penalty area (102).

Only Moise Kean (15) and Lautaro Martínez (13.5) produce more xG than Nikola Krstović (13) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.



The official head-to-head record between the two sides in Rome stands at 52 meetings: 27 Lazio wins (the most recent 1-0, Coppa Italia 2021/22), 12 draws (the most recent 1-1, Serie A 2024/25) and 13 Udinese victories (the most recent 1-2, Serie A 2023/24).

Lazio are the 2025/26 Serie A side with the most goals scored in stoppage time beyond the 90th minute (6, level with Juventus).

Lazio are the 2025/26 Serie A side with the most red cards received (7).

Only Inter (16) have kept more clean sheets than Lazio in the 2025/26 Serie A season (15, level with Como).

Udinese are the side that scores the fewest goals through substitutes (2, level with Verona).

Udinese are one of 6 sides in the 2025/26 Serie A season that concede the most goals in the opening 15 minutes of the second half (9, level with Como, Fiorentina, Genoa, Cagliari and Torino).

This is the 2nd official meeting between Maurizio Sarri and Kosta Runjaic: the previous encounter ended 1-1 on 27 December 2025 (Udinese 1-1 Lazio, Serie A).

Only Marco Palestra (105) has been fouled more times in the 2025/26 Serie A season than Mattia Zaccagni (81).

Only Jean Butez (719) completes more forward passes in the defensive half than Alessio Romagnoli (627) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Keinan Davis is one of 3 players in the 2025/26 Serie A season to have converted the most penalties (4), level with Vlasić (Torino) and Çalhanoğlu (Inter).

Only Ylber Ramadani (91) makes more offensive recoveries in the 2025/26 Serie A season than Jesper Karlström (71, level with Morten Frendrup).

Only Mateo Pellegrino (47) wins more ground duels in the attacking half than Keinan Davis (43) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.
