SERIE A 2025/2026



Inter are Champions of Italy after just 35 matchdays: it is the 6th title won by the Nerazzurri with at least three matchdays to spare. Overall, it is the 21st trophy in the Milanese club's cabinet.

To find two sides mathematically relegated to Serie B as early as matchday 35, you have to go back to the 2020/21 season: on that occasion it was Parma and Crotone; this time it has been the turn of Verona and Pisa.

On 8 May 1898, the anniversary falls of the first Serie A title, still contested before the single round-robin format was introduced. It was the title won in a single day by Genoa: the Grifone claimed the final victory over Internazionale Torino, in the Piedmontese capital, 2-1 after extra time. The two semi-finals had been played that morning: Genoa 2-0 Ginnastica Torinese and Internazionale Torino 2-1 FC Torinese.

On 8 May 1983, Roma won their 2nd league title by drawing 1-1 at Marassi against Genoa on the penultimate matchday of the season. The goals were scored by former Roma man Pruzzo in the 19th minute and Fiorini in the 41st. The Giallorossi maintained a +4 gap over Juventus, who had in the meantime won 1-2 in Cagliari.



TORINO



SASSUOLO

There have been 15 previous meetings in Turin between the two teams: 8 wins for Torino (most recent 2-1, 2023/24 Serie A), 2 draws (most recent 1-1, 2021/22 Serie A), and 5 wins for Sassuolo (most recent 0-1, 2022/23 Serie A).

Sassuolo's first-ever Serie A match was in Turin against Torino: on August 25, 2013, it ended 2-0 for the home side, with goals from Brighi and Cerci.

Torino is unbeaten at home with D'Aversa at the helm: 3 wins and 1 draw in 4 matches played.

Torino is the 2025/26 Serie A team with the fewest different scorers (10, tied with Verona).

Only Pisa (63) **has conceded more goals than Torino (58) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.**

Torino is the 2025/26 Serie A team that concedes the most goals between the 46th and 60th minutes (10, tied with Udinese, Fiorentina, and Pisa).

Torino is one of two 2025/26 Serie A teams without a red card in their favor, alongside Milan.

Sassuolo has kept a clean sheet for 225 minutes: the last goal conceded was by Nico Paz in the 45th minute of Sassuolo-Como 2-1 on April 17.

Roberto D'Aversa and Fabio Grosso face off for the 4th time in official matches: their head-to-head record is even, with one win each and one draw.

Only Evan Ndicka (216) **has made more defensive recoveries than Jay Idzes** (192, tied with Marin Pongracic) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Domenico Berardi scores against Milan: the Neroverdi forward's 8th goal in this league campaign. He hadn't scored since February 20 (Sassuolo-Verona 3-0, Serie A).

Armand Laurienté scored against Milan: the French forward's sixth goal in this league season. He hadn't scored since March 9 (Lazio-Sassuolo 2-1, Serie A).



The official head-to-head record between the two sides in Cagliari stands at 36 meetings: 13 Sardinian wins (the most recent 2-1, Serie A 2017/18), 11 draws (the most recent 0-0, Serie A 2023/24) and 12 Friulian victories (the most recent 1-2, Serie A 2024/25).

Cagliari's last home win against Udinese dates back to 14 April 2018 (2-1, with goals from Leonardo Pavoletti and Luca Ceppitelli to overturn Kevin Lasagna's opener for the visitors).

Cagliari and Udinese both come into this match having collected 7 points in their last 4 Serie A matches: 2 wins, 1 defeat and 1 draw for both sides.

Cagliari have not won away from home since 24 January (Fiorentina 1-2 Cagliari, Serie A). In the subsequent 6 home matchdays, 4 defeats and 2 draws.

Udinese have not lost away from home since 23 February (Bologna 1-0 Udinese, Serie A). In the subsequent 4 away matchdays, 2 draws (against Atalanta and Lazio) and 2 wins (against Genoa and Milan), averaging 2.5 goals per match.

Cagliari can secure mathematical survival on this matchday with a positive result: the Sardinians hold a 9-point advantage over third-from-bottom Cremonese. Pisacane would achieve survival one matchday earlier than in each of the past two seasons (Ranieri in 2023/24 and Nicola in 2024/25 both secured safety mathematically on the penultimate matchday).

Udinese have not finished a Serie A season with more than 47 points – their current tally – **since 2012/13** (66 on that occasion), when they finished fifth in the final standings.

Cagliari are the 2025/26 Serie A side that has taken the fewest penalties (2, level with Lecce and Parma).

Cagliari are the 2025/26 Serie A side that averages the fewest passes in the attacking third per match (59.7).

Only Fiorentina (15.7) and Genoa (15.1) concede more fouls on average per match than Cagliari (15.05) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Only Verona (15.9) commits more fouls on average per match than Cagliari (14.2) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Only Sassuolo (10) and Cremonese (9) concede more goals in the opening 15 minutes than Cagliari (8, level with Fiorentina and Verona) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.



Udinese are the 2025/26 Serie A side that scores the fewest goals through substitutes (2).

Udinese are the 2025/26 Serie A side that concedes the most goals in the opening 15 minutes of the second half (10, level with Torino, Fiorentina and Pisa).

Udinese are the 2025/26 Serie A side with the highest percentage of ground duels won in the defensive half (62.58%).

Only Inter (16) and Sassuolo (8) score more goals from corners than Udinese (7, level with Roma, Napoli and Atalanta) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

This is the 2nd official meeting between Fabio Pisacane and Kosta Runjaic: the only previous encounter, the first leg, ended 1-1.

Kosta Runjaic surpasses his own points record in a Serie A season: 47 from 35 matchdays, already 3 more than the 44 accumulated at the end of the 2024/25 campaign.

Thomas Kristensen on the scoresheet against Torino: the Danish defender's 3rd goal of the campaign – his best scoring season in his career.

Kingsley Ehizibue on the scoresheet against Torino: the Nigerian defender's 2nd goal of the campaign (both scored in his last two matches, against Torino and Lazio). He has equalled his personal record in Italy, set in the 2022/23 Serie A season.



The official head-to-head record between the two sides in Rome stands at 91 meetings: 33 Lazio wins (the most recent 2-1, Serie A 2022/23), 31 draws (the most recent 1-1, Serie A 2007/08) and 27 Inter victories (the most recent 0-6, Serie A 2024/25).

Lazio have failed to score in their last two home matches against the Nerazzurri. Their last goal in this fixture dates back to 26 August 2022 (Lazio 3-1 Inter, Serie A 2022/23).

Lazio have collected 17 points in their last 8 matchdays: their only defeat in that period came in Florence (Fiorentina 1-0 Lazio, 13 April). Only Juventus have earned more points (18) in the same period.

Lazio are the 2025/26 Serie A side with the most red cards received (7).

The two sides that score the most goals in the final 15 minutes of matches, including stoppage time, go head-to-head: 19 for Inter, 15 for Lazio.

Inter are the only side in the 2025/26 Serie A season not to have had a player sent off.

Inter are the 2025/26 Serie A side with the most goals scored (82). The last time a side had scored more at this stage of the season dates back to 2020/21 (84 goals in 35 matchdays for Gasperini's Atalanta).

Inter are the 2025/26 Serie A side with the most goals scored by substitutes (13).

Inter are the 2025/26 Serie A side with the highest shot-to-goal conversion rate (13.1%).

Inter are the 2025/26 Serie A side that completes the most passes in the attacking third per match (143).

Inter are the 2025/26 Serie A side that concedes the fewest shots on average (8.7 per match).

Inter are on a run of 8 matches without defeat across all competitions: their last loss came in the Derby della Madonnina (Milan 1-0 Inter, 8 March). Since then, 5 wins and 3 draws in the following 8 official matches across the league and Coppa Italia.

This is the 2nd official meeting between Maurizio Sarri and Cristian Chivu, following the Nerazzurri manager's victory on 9 November 2025 in the first leg (Inter 2-0 Lazio, Serie A).

No player scores more goals as a substitute than Noslin (4) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

LECCE



JUVENTUS

The official head-to-head record between the two sides in Salento stands at 24 meetings: 3 Giallorossi wins (the most recent 2-0, Serie A 2010/11), 6 draws (the most recent 1-1, Serie A 2024/25) and 15 Juventus victories (the most recent 0-3, Serie A 2023/24).

Lecce's last home win against Juventus at the Via del Mare dates back to 20 February 2011, a 2-0 Serie A victory with goals from Mesbah and Bertolacci.

Lecce could mathematically secure their Serie A survival for a fourth consecutive season at the end of matchday 36 – a club record. Should the Salentini win and Cremonese lose against already-relegated Pisa, the Giallorossi would hold a 7-point advantage with 180 minutes of the season remaining.

Lecce are on a 3-matchday unbeaten run: 1 win and 2 draws – their joint-longest positive streak of the campaign, matching the run between matchdays 5 and 7 of the first half of the season (an identical record).

Only Verona (37.2%) win a lower percentage of duels in the attacking half than Lecce (37.6%) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Only Cremonese (10.6) and Pisa (9.6) concede more shots from inside the penalty area per match on average than Lecce (9.1) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Lecce are the 2025/26 Serie A side with the fewest goals scored (24, level with Verona). In each of the last two seasons, the lowest-scoring side in the league still secured survival (Lecce again in 2024/25 with 27 goals, Empoli in 2023/24 with 29).

Juventus are on a 10-match unbeaten run across all competitions: 6 wins and 4 draws. Their last defeat dates back to 4 February (Juventus 0-2 Como, Serie A).

Juventus are the 2025/26 Serie A side that concedes the most goals in first-half stoppage time (4).

Only Inter (13) score more goals through substitutes than Juventus (11) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

This is the 8th official meeting between Eusebio Di Francesco and Luciano Spalletti: the Juventus manager is unbeaten in the previous 7 encounters, with 4 wins and 3 draws.

Konan N'Dri is the 2025/26 Serie A player who has come off the bench the most times (23, level with Amin Sarr and Caleb Ekuban).

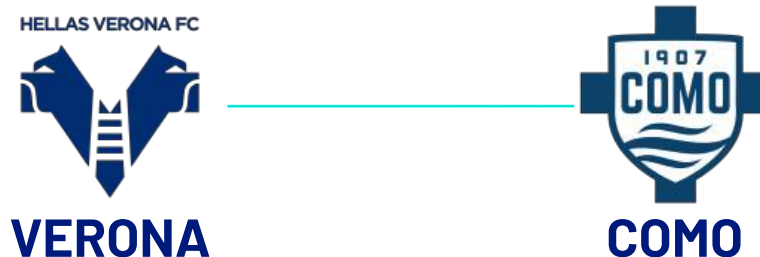
No goalkeeper has saved more shots from inside the penalty area than Wladimiro Falcone (82) among those in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

No player completes more dribbles than Kenan Yildiz (96) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Only Nico Paz (46) shoots on target more times than Kenan Yildiz (38) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

No player attempts more forward passes than Manuel Locatelli (1,326) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Only Santiago Pierotti (76) wins more tackles than Manuel Locatelli (73, level with Morten Frentrup) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.



There have been 17 previous official matches in Verona: 8 wins for Verona (most recent 6-0, 2009/10 Serie C Coppa Italia), 6 draws (most recent 1-1, 2024/25 Serie A) and 3 wins for Como (most recent 0-2, 2010/11 Lega Pro).

Verona were mathematically relegated to Serie B at the end of the last matchday: the Gialloblù have 20 points in the table, 12 points behind Lecce in 19th place.

Como are one win away from their all-time record for wins in a Serie A season: they have secured 17 wins so far; the record dates back to 1950/51 (18).

Should they beat Verona, Como could mathematically qualify for the current European competitions for the first time in their history.

Only Pisa (63) and Torino (58) **have conceded more goals than Verona (57)** in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Verona are the Serie A side who have scored the fewest goals in the second halves (9).

Verona is the 2025/26 Serie A side that commits the most fouls on average (15.9) and receives the most yellow cards (79).

Verona is the 2025/26 Serie A side with the fewest different goalscorers (10, the same as Torino).

Only Pisa (21.9) **on average wins more aerial duels than Verona (21.3)** in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Only Roma (10) **concedes fewer first-half goals than Como (12)** in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Only Inter (19) and Juventus (13) **score more headed goals than Como (10, the same as Roma and Cagliari) in the 2025/26 Serie A season**

Only Inter (13%) and Roma (11.9%) **convert a higher percentage of shots into goals than Como (11.8%) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.**

Paolo Sammarco and Cesc Fabregas face each other for the first time in a competitive match.

Kieron Bowie scores against Juventus: the Scottish striker's third goal in Serie A.



The head-to-head record between the two sides in Cremona stands at 21 meetings: 9 Grigiorossi wins (the most recent 2-1, Serie B 2023/24), 6 draws (the most recent 1-1, Serie B 2021/22) and 6 Pisa victories (the most recent 1-3, Serie B 2024/25).

The first ever official Serie A meeting between Cremonese and Pisa at the Zini.

In the last 6 fixtures at the Zini, both sides have always found the net. The record stands at 12 goals for Cremonese and 13 for Pisa.

Cremonese have collected just 1 point in their last 5 matches. Their only draw dates back to 19 April 2026 (Cremonese 0-0 Torino, Serie A).

Cremonese have gone 10 home matches without a win: their last victory was on 7 December 2025, Cremonese 2-0 Lecce. Since then, 4 draws and 6 defeats.

Cremonese are the 2025/26 Serie A side that loses the most defensive balls on average (28.1 per match).

Cremonese are the 2025/26 Serie A side that concedes the most corners on average (6.1 per match).

Cremonese are the 2025/26 Serie A side that concedes the most shots inside the penalty area on average (10.5 per match).

The two sides that concede the most balls played inside the penalty area on average in the 2025/26 Serie A season go head-to-head: Pisa (24.3) and Cremonese (23.3).

Pisa are on a run of 6 consecutive Serie A defeats. Their last win dates back to 15 March 2026 (Pisa 3-1 Cagliari).

Pisa are the 2025/26 Serie A side that wins the most duels on average (38.7 per match).

Pisa are the 2025/26 Serie A side that concedes the most second-half goals (38).

Pisa are the 2025/26 Serie A side that concedes the most goals from opposition substitutes (12, level with Verona).

This is the first official meeting between Marco Giampaolo and Oscar Hiljemark.



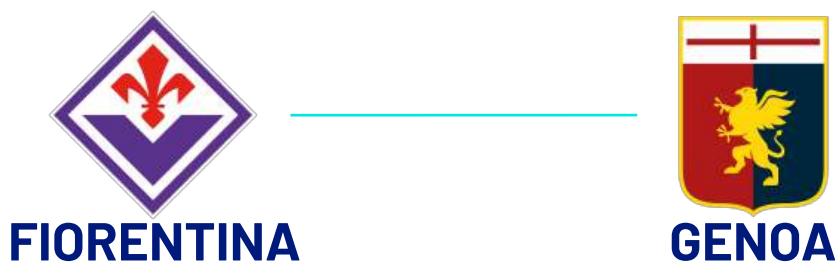
CREMONESE



PISA

No player completes more long passes than Emil Audero (337) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

No goalkeeper makes more saves from shots outside the penalty area than Emil Audero (46) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.



There have been 57 previous official matches between the two sides in Florence: Fiorentina have won 34 (most recently 2-1 in last season's Serie A), 19 draws (most recently 1-1 in the 2023/24 Serie A season) and Genoa have won 4 (most recently 1-2 in the 1976/77 Serie A season).

Looking at the second half of the season alone, **Fiorentina and Genoa have collected the same number of points (24), sitting 10th and 11th respectively in this specific table.**

Fiorentina have gone 240 minutes without scoring: their last goal was scored by Harrison in the 30th minute of the 1-1 draw at Lecce on 20 April.

Genoa have gone 215 minutes without scoring: the last goal was scored by Colombo from the penalty spot in the 55th minute of the 1-2 defeat to Pisa on 19 April.

The two teams facing off are the ones that have dropped the most points from leading positions in the 2025/26 Serie A season (Fiorentina with 24 and Genoa with 20).

Fiorentina are one of the four teams in the 2025/26 Serie A who **have conceded the most goals in the first 15 minutes of the second half** (10, alongside Udinese, Pisa and Torino).

Fiorentina are the team in Serie A **who have conceded the most headed goals (15).**

Genoa are the Serie A 2025/26 side **with the lowest percentage of successful duels (46.5%).**

This match pits the two teams that have conceded the most goals from set-pieces in the 2025/26 Serie A season against each other (Genoa with 19 and Fiorentina with 18).

Only Inter (24) **have scored more goals from set-pieces than Genoa (16) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.**

This is the third official meeting between Paolo Vanoli and Daniele De Rossi: one win for the Viola manager and one draw.

Marin Pongracic is the player in the 2025/26 Serie A season **who has received the most yellow cards (11).**

Only Mateo Pellegrino (5) **has scored more headed goals than Leo Østigård (4, the same as Lautaro Martinez and Marcus Thuram) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.**

No player has been substituted more times during a match than Lorenzo Colombo (26) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.



PARMA



ROMA

There have been 31 official matches in Parma: the record stands at 10 wins for the Emilian side (most recent 2-0, Serie A 2020/21), 6 draws (most recent 0-0, Serie A 2010/11) and 15 wins for the Giallorossi (most recent 0-1, Serie A 2024/25).

There have been no draws in the last nine meetings between the two sides at the Tardini: three wins for Parma and six for Roma. The last draw was a 0-0 in Serie A on 24 October 2010.

Roma have won six of their last seven matches against Parma (at the Tardini and the Olimpico) across Serie A and the Coppa Italia: Parma's only victory came on 14 March 2021 (Parma 2-0 Roma, Serie A).

Parma have won two of their last three matches against Roma at the Tardini: both 2-0 victories in the 2019/20 and 2020/21 Serie A seasons. The Giallorossi's 1-0 win on 16 February 2025 completes the record.

Since the 2015/16 season, **among the players currently in the Parma and Roma squads, the top scorers in matches** (at the Tardini and the Olimpico) across all competitions are Paulo Dybala, Artem Dovbyk and Lorenzo Pellegrini, all on two goals.

Roma are coming off the back of scoring 4 goals against Fiorentina: the Giallorossi hadn't managed that in official matches since 24 February 2025 (Roma v Monza 4-0, Serie A).

Roma are coming off the back of scoring 3 goals in the first half against Fiorentina: the Giallorossi hadn't managed that in Serie A since 29 December 2025 against Genoa.

Roma have scored at least two goals in the first half in three of their last four Serie A matches (Roma v Pisa, Bologna v Roma, Roma v Fiorentina).

Only Inter and Como (17 each) **have kept a clean sheet against Roma (16) more times than Roma** have in Serie A 2025/26.

Only Inter (15.9) **make more offensive recoveries on average than Roma (14.9)** in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Facing the team that has taken the fewest penalties (Parma with 2, alongside Cagliari and Lecce) **and the team that has conceded the fewest** (Roma with 1).

Parma are the Serie A 2025/26 side **with the most red cards awarded in their favour (7).**



PARMA



ROMA

Only Inter (8) **average more crosses from set pieces than Parma (7.6) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.**

The second official meeting between Carlos Cuesta and Gian Piero Gasperini: in their only previous encounter, the first leg, the Roma manager's side won 2-1.

Mateo Pellegrino is the player who has contested the most aerial duels (282) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Mario Hermoso scores against Fiorentina: the Spanish defender's third goal of the season; for the first time in his career, he has scored a goal and provided an assist in the same match. Furthermore, with five goal contributions (three goals and two assists), the Giallorossi player has equalled his best-ever season in a single league campaign (three goals and two assists also in 2022/23 with Atlético Madrid in LaLiga).

Wesley scores against Fiorentina: the Brazilian's fifth goal in Serie A. It is his best season in terms of goals scored.

Niccolò Pisilli scores and provides an assist against Fiorentina: the Italian midfielder has both scored and provided an assist in the same match for the second time in Serie A (the first on 7 December 2024, Roma 4-1 Lecce).

Since Donyell Malen's arrival in Serie A (Matchday 21), **only Federico Bonazzoli (42.8%) has a higher percentage of goals for his team than the Dutchman (39.2%).**



MILAN



ATALANTA

In the 73 official matches at San Siro, the record stands at 37 Rossoneri wins (the last being a 2-0 victory in the 2022/23 Serie A season), 23 draws (the last being a 1-1 draw in the 2023/24 Serie A season) and 13 Nerazzurri wins (the last being a 0-1 victory in the 2024/25 Serie A season).

Only Bologna (2) **are caught offside on average more often than Atalanta (1.94) and Milan (1.86) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.**

No team in the 2025/26 **Serie A season has earned more points from behind than Milan (14).**

Milan are the team in the 2025/26 Serie A season **who have made the fewest substitutions** (142 out of 175 available).

Only Inter (90) and Juventus (72) **created more clear-cut chances than Milan (66)** in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Only Inter (29) and Roma (22) **took the lead first more often than Milan (20, the same as Juventus) among the teams in the 2025/26 Serie A season.**

Milan have won just 1 match in their last 5 fixtures, with the remaining results being 1 draw and 3 defeats. During this period, they have scored just one goal (Rabiot in the 41st minute of Verona v Milan 0-1 on 19 April) and the Rossoneri have now gone 229 minutes without scoring.

Only Cagliari (53.75%) and Genoa (54.07%) **have a lower percentage of duels won in their defensive half than Atalanta (56.41%) in Serie A 2025/26.**

Only Inter (289) **have completed more crosses than Atalanta (207)** in the 2025/26 Serie A season **and only Inter (137) have attempted more headed shots than Atalanta (94).**

This is the fifth official meeting between Massimiliano Allegri and Raffaele Palladino: they have faced each other four times previously, with two wins apiece.

Raffaele Palladino made his professional managerial debut by beating Allegri: Monza 1-0 Juventus in Serie A on 18 September 2022.

Only Kenan Yildiz (144) **has attempted more dribbles than Alexis Saelemaekers (114, the same as Marco Palestra)** among players in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Only Manuel Locatelli (2583) **has attempted more passes than Luka Modrić (2238)** among players in the 2025/26 Serie A season.



MILAN

Only Riccardo Orsolini (7) **has hit the woodwork more times than Gianluca Scamacca (4)** among players in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Only Wladimiro Falcone (82) and Arijanet Murić (79) **have saved more shots from inside the box than Marco Carnesecchi (73)** among goalkeepers in Serie A 2025/26.

Only Nicolò Barella (109) **has attempted more passes into the box than Charles De Ketelaere (105)** in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

No player averages more shots than Nikola Krstović (4.72) among Serie A 2025/26 players; furthermore, only Moise Kean (14.98) has accumulated more xG than the Atalanta striker (14.12).



NAPOLI



BOLOGNA

There have been 76 previous official matches between the two sides in Naples: the record stands at 40 wins for the Azzurri (the last being a 3-0 victory in the 2024/25 Serie A season), 23 draws (the last being a 1-1 draw in the 2011/12 Serie A season) and 13 Bologna wins (the last 0-2, Serie A 2023/24).

Napoli are the Serie A 2025/26 side **with the most different goalscorers (19).**

Napoli are the 2025/26 Serie A side **who have scored the most goals in the first 15 minutes of play (11),** alongside Inter and Como.

Napoli have not conceded a goal for 213 minutes. The last goal conceded by Basic came in the 57th minute on 18 April 2026 (Napoli v Lazio 0-2, Serie A).

Napoli are the 2025/26 Serie A side **to have conceded the most penalties (9).**

Only Inter (1797') and Roma (1409') **have spent more time in the lead than Napoli (1387')** in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Only Inter (24) and Genoa (16) **scored more goals from set-pieces than Napoli (15) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.**

Only Milan (14) **came from behind to claim more points than Napoli (13)** in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Bologna are the team in the 2025/26 Serie A **season making the most substitutions (174 out of 175).**

Bologna have picked up just one point from their last three competitive matches. Their last win dates back to 12 April 2026 (Bologna 2-0 Lecce, Serie A).

Only Verona (79.9) and Genoa (79.8) **are involved in more duels on average than Bologna (76.6)** in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Only Verona (7) **concedes more goals in second-half stoppage time than Bologna (6, alongside Fiorentina, Pisa and Genoa)** in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

No team in the 2025/26 Serie A **season averages more long passes than Bologna (79.9).**

The 7th official meeting between Antonio Conte and Vincenzo Italiano: the Azzurri manager leads 3-1, with two draws rounding off the head-to-head record.

Only Mike Maignan (8) **has faced more penalties than Vanja Miliković-Savić (7)** among Serie A goalkeepers in the 2025/26 season, **but no one has saved more than the Azzurri goalkeeper (3).**

Only Federico Dimarco (146) **attempts more crosses from the byline than Matteo Politano (103)** in Serie A 2025/26.

Only Mateo Pellegrino (225) **wins more ground duels than Rasmus Højlund (168) and Santiago Castro (162, the same as Vitorinha)** in Serie A 2025/26.
