SERIE A 2025/2026



The second-half-of-season standings after 13 matchdays: Inter 30; Napoli 27; Atalanta, Como 25; Juventus 24; Fiorentina 22; Milan, Roma 21; Genoa 20; Bologna, Lazio, Sassuolo 19; Udinese 18; Parma 17; Torino 16; Cagliari 14; Lecce 10; Pisa 6; Cremonese, Verona 5.

On 17 April 1994, Milan clinched their 14th league title mathematically, thanks to a 2-2 draw at San Siro against Udinese on the third-to-last matchday of the season. It was the Rossoneri's third consecutive title under Fabio Capello – the first and only such instance in the club's history.

Inter top of the table with 5 defeats after 32 matchdays: in the new century, it had never happened that the league leaders after 32 matches had recorded such a high number of losses. The last precedent dates back to 1998/99, when Lazio led the table with 5 defeats: at the end of that season, it was not the Romans who won the title – which was then contested over 34 matchdays with 18 teams – but Milan.

It had not been since the 2021/22 season that the Champions League qualification threshold was this high after 32 matchdays (60 points): on that occasion too, the side in 4th place was Juventus, on 62 points.

Cremonese and Lecce are level on 27 points: it has not been since 2020/21 that, after 32 matchdays, the third-from-bottom side had accumulated a higher points total. On that occasion, Cagliari occupied 18th place with 28 points.

Donyell Malen on the scoresheet against Pisa: from the 2015/16 season onwards, the Dutchman is the winter transfer window signing to have scored the most goals in the season of his Serie A arrival (10, level with Zlatan Ibrahimović in 2019/20 with Milan). The last Serie A hat-trick before Donyell Malen's had been scored by Moise Kean in Fiorentina 3-1 Verona on 10 November 2024. In between, only Mateo Retegui had surpassed 3 goals in a single match, netting 4 in Verona 0-4 Atalanta on 8 February 2025.



SASSUOLO



COMO

A first-ever competitive meeting between the two sides in Emilia.

Sassuolo are the 2025/26 Serie A side that concedes the most goals between the 1st and 15th minute (10).

Only Inter (11) score more goals than Como (10, level with Napoli) in the opening 15 minutes of matches in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Como are the 2025/26 Serie A side that concedes the fewest goals (26): 8 of those 26 were let in across the two fixtures against Inter.

Como are unbeaten away from home in 2026: 6 wins and 3 draws for the Lariani in their 9 official matches played. Their last away defeat dates back to 15 December (Roma 1-0 Como, Serie A).

Como are 2 wins away from their all-time record for victories in a single Serie A season: they have claimed 16 so far, with the record standing at 18, set in 1950/51. Their all-time points record, however, has already been equalled (it would also have been 58 in the 1950/51 season, had a win been worth 3 points).

This is the 3rd official meeting between Fabio Grosso and Cesc Fàbregas: the Spanish manager has won both previous encounters without conceding a goal across 180 minutes played – 3-0 in the Coppa Italia and 2-0 in Serie A, both in the current season.

No goalkeeper makes more sweeping actions than Arijanet Murić (171) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Considering Italian players only, only Pio Esposito and Cesare Casadei (5) have scored more Serie A goals than Andrea Pinamonti (4, level with Dimarco, Kean and Colombo) in 2026.

Jean Butez is one of 6 players who has not missed a single minute in the 2025/26 Serie A season: 32 appearances out of 32 and 2,880 minutes on the pitch, excluding stoppage time – along with Svilar, Falcone, Carnesecchi, Caprile and De Gea.

Nico Paz on the scoresheet against Inter: the Como midfielder's 11th league goal of the season, drawing level with teammate Douvikas in second place in the 2025/26 Serie A top scorers chart.

Álex Valle on the scoresheet against Inter: the Como defender's first professional career goal.



INTER



CAGLIARI

The official head-to-head record between the two sides in Milan stands at 51 meetings: 32 Nerazzurri wins (the most recent 3-1, Serie A 2021/22), 11 draws (the most recent 2-2, Serie A 2023/24) and 8 Sardinian victories (the most recent 1-2, Serie A 2016/17).

Inter have scored in 32 consecutive home matches against Cagliari, netting a total of 73 goals. Their last blank dates back to 8 March 1992, a 0-0 draw in Serie A.

Inter are the only side in the 2025/26 Serie A season yet to have a player sent off.

Inter are the 2025/26 Serie A side with the most goals scored by substitutes (11).

Inter are the 2025/26 Serie A side with the most goals scored (75). Over the last 6 league seasons, at matchday 32, only Simone Inzaghi's Inter side of 2023/24 had managed to outscore the current Chivu-led team, with 77 goals at the same stage.

Inter have gone 5 official matches without a clean sheet, conceding a total of 8 goals. Their last shutout dates back to 3 March 2026 (Como 0-0 Inter, Coppa Italia). Inter had not endured a run of this length without a clean sheet since the March-April 2025 period (10 matches on that occasion).

Inter are the 2025/26 Serie A side with the most goals scored from outside the penalty area (11).

Inter are the 2025/26 Serie A side that attempts the most shots per match (17.4).

Inter are the 2025/26 Serie A side with the highest Field Tilt value (68.61%).

Only Verona (71) have received more yellow cards than Cagliari (70, level with Fiorentina).

Cagliari are the 2025/26 Serie A side with the highest number of defensive recoveries per match (38.5).

Cagliari are one of 3 sides in the 2025/26 Serie A season that have taken the fewest penalties (2), level with Lecce and Parma.

This is the 2nd official meeting between Cristian Chivu and Fabio Pisacane: in the only previous encounter, the Nerazzurri head coach came out on top in Cagliari 0-2 Inter, Serie A 2025/26.



INTER



CAGLIARI

Hakan Çalhanoğlu is one of 3 players in the 2025/26 Serie A season to have converted the most penalties (4), level with Vlasić and Davis.

Marco Palestra is the 2025/26 Serie A player with the highest number of fouls suffered (100).

Only Kenan Yildiz (91) and Alexis Saelemaekers (78) have completed more dribbles than Marco Palestra (73) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Elia Caprile is one of 6 players who has not missed a single minute in the 2025/26 Serie A season: 32 appearances out of 32 and 2,880 minutes on the pitch, excluding stoppage time – along with Svilar, Falcone, Carnesecchi, Butez and De Gea.



UDINESE



PARMA

The official head-to-head record between the two sides in Friuli stands at 41 meetings: 25 Udinese wins (the most recent 1-0, Serie A 2024/25), 9 draws (the most recent 2-2, Serie A 2009/10) and 7 Parma victories (the most recent 1-3, Serie A 2019/20).

Udinese's last defeat against Parma dates back to 26 January 2020 (Parma 2-0 Udinese, goals from Kulusevski and Gagliolo).

Udinese are on a run of 3 consecutive wins against Parma: in the last two, the Bianconeri have kept a clean sheet.

Parma's last goal in Udine was scored by Yann Karamoh (Udinese 3-2 Parma, 18 October 2020).

Udinese have kept a clean sheet for 322 minutes: the last goal they conceded was scored by Boga in the 38th minute of Udinese 0-1 Juventus on 14 March.

Parma have gone 6 consecutive Serie A matches without a win: their last victory dates back to 22 February (Milan 0-1 Parma).

Parma had not conceded so few goals (40) after 32 Serie A matchdays since the 2009/10 season under Francesco Guidolin (39 on that occasion).

Parma sit on 36 points after 32 matchdays: 8 more than last season. To find a better Serie A return for the Crociati, you have to go back to the 2019/20 campaign, when Parma stood on 40 points. Over the last five Serie A seasons, only in 2019/20 did Parma (12th in the table) begin matchday 33 in a better position than their current 14th place.

Parma have scored 23 goals after 32 matchdays: they have never scored so few at this stage in their Serie A history.

Udinese are the side that scores the fewest goals through substitutes (2, level with Verona).

This is the 2nd official meeting between Kosta Runjaic and Carlos Cuesta, following the Bianconeri manager's 0-2 away win at the Tardini in the first leg.

Keinan Davis is one of 3 players in the 2025/26 Serie A season to have converted the most penalties – 4, level with Vlasić (Torino) and Çalhanoglu (Inter).

Keinan Davis reaches 10 Serie A goals: it had not been since 2021/22 that an English player had reached double figures. The last to do so was Tammy Abraham (17) in a Roma shirt.



NAPOLI



LAZIO

There have been 81 official matches between the two sides in Naples: the record stands at 39 wins for Napoli (the most recent a 4-0 victory in the 2021/22 Serie A season), 23 draws (the most recent a 1-1 draw in the 2016/17 Serie A season) and 18 wins for Lazio (the most recent a 0-1 victory in the 2024/25 Serie A season).

Napoli are coming off the back of three consecutive home defeats against Lazio: their last victory dates back to the 2021/22 Serie A season, a 4-0 win for the Azzurri. The Neapolitans have never lost four times in a row against Lazio on home soil.

Napoli have won just once in their last seven competitive matches against Lazio (at the Maradona and the Olimpico): that was the 0-2 first-leg victory, with goals from Rrahmani and Spinazzola. The overall record stands at four wins for Lazio and two draws.

Napoli won their second Scudetto by beating Lazio at the Maradona: 1-0 on 29 April 1990 (the final day of the league season) with a decisive goal from Marco Baroni.

Napoli are the only team in Serie A 2025/26 without a home defeat. In the league, their last home defeat came against Lazio, 0-1 on 8 December 2024. Since then, they have played 26 matches, with 19 wins and 7 draws.

Only Roma (9) **have conceded fewer goals than Napoli (13, the same as Juventus) at home in the 2025/26 Serie A season.**

Napoli are the 2025/26 Serie A side with the most penalties conceded (8, the same as Milan).

Only Inter (23) **have scored more goals from set-pieces than Napoli (18) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.**

Napoli are the 2025/26 Serie A side with the most different players to have scored (19).

Only Roma (52.9) **on average win back more balls than Napoli (51.6) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.**

Lazio lost in the last league match: ending a run of four consecutive positive results (the second-longest run for the Biancocelesti in this Serie A season, after the six positive results between late September and early November 2025).

Only Milan and Como (11 each) **have conceded fewer goals than Lazio (12) away from home in the 2025/26 Serie A season.**



NAPOLI



LAZIO

Lazio are the 2025/26 Serie A side with the fewest goals scored away from home (10, level with Lecce).

Lazio are the 2025/26 Serie A side with the most goals scored in stoppage time after the 90th minute (6, level with Juventus).

Only Inter (52.8%) and Pisa (52.3%) **win a higher percentage of duels than Lazio (52.2%) and Napoli (52%) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.**

Lazio are the 2025/26 Serie A side with the most red cards received (7).

In the last 17 seasons, only in 2009/10 (34) did Lazio collect fewer points than in this campaign (44) after 32 matchdays.

Fourth official meeting between Antonio Conte and Maurizio Sarri: in the three previous encounters, the Napoli manager has won once and the Lazio manager twice.

Maurizio Sarri is the former manager of the day: he managed Napoli from 2015/16 to 2017/18, overseeing 148 official matches with a record of 98 wins, 25 draws and 25 defeats.

Scott McTominay scores against Parma: the Scottish midfielder's eighth goal in this league campaign. It is his second-best season in terms of goals, after the 12 he scored in the 2024/25 Serie A season. The former Man United player is top of the Serie A scoring charts for Scottish players with 20 goals, ahead of Lewis Ferguson on 15.

Only Johan Vasquez (1,372) and Marin Pongracic (1,362) **have played more balls in the defensive half than Mario Gila (1,344) and Alessio Romagnoli (1,340) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.**



ROMA



ATALANTA

The official head-to-head record between the two sides in Rome stands at 71 meetings: 40 Giallorossi wins (the most recent 1-0, Serie A 2021/22), 22 draws (the most recent 1-1, Serie A 2023/24) and 9 Atalanta victories (the most recent 0-2, Serie A 2024/25).

Roma have won just 1 of their last 11 home Serie A matches against Atalanta: 1-0 in 2021/22. The remaining results consist of 5 Bergamo wins and 5 draws.

Atalanta are on a run of 7 consecutive unbeaten matches against Roma in Serie A (at the New Balance Arena and the Olimpico), including 4 wins in a row: Roma's last victory dates back to the 1-0 in the 2021/22 Serie A season.

From the 2015/16 season onwards, among players currently in the Roma and Atalanta squads, the top scorer in head-to-head clashes (at the New Balance Arena and the Olimpico) is Marten de Roon, with 3 goals.

Roma have scored in each of their last 12 home official matches, netting a total of 26 goals. Their last home game without scoring dates back to 30 November 2025, Roma 0-1 Napoli.

Roma are the 2025/26 Serie A side that has conceded the fewest penalties (1).

Only Inter (16.3) **average more offensive recoveries per match than Roma (15.2) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.**

Only Inter (26) **score the opening goal of the match more often than Roma (20) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.**

Only Inter (96) **attempt more shots from corners than Roma (66) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.**

Roma have lost 7 home official matches in the current season across all competitions: the last time the Giallorossi suffered 7 home defeats by the month of April was in 2017/18, under manager Eusebio Di Francesco.

Atalanta failed to score in the previous round: they had been finding the net in 8 consecutive Serie A matches.

Only Inter (191) **deliver more crosses from corners than Atalanta (163) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.**

Only Inter (70.2) and Juventus (62.2) **produce more xG than Atalanta (60.3) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.**



ROMA



ATALANTA

Only Bologna (80.6) and Cremonese (69.1) average more long passes per match than Atalanta (68.5) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Only Pisa (60.7%) and Parma (60.1%) win a higher percentage of tackles than Atalanta (58.1%) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

This is the 7th official meeting between Gian Piero Gasperini and Raffaele Palladino: across the previous 6 encounters, 4 wins for the Roma head coach and 2 for the Atalanta manager.

Gian Piero Gasperini is a former manager of today's opponents: he led Atalanta from 2016/17 to 2024/25, accumulating 439 matches on the bench with a record of 228 wins, 102 draws and 109 defeats, winning the Europa League in 2023/24. He is the manager with the most appearances on the Atalanta bench in the club's history.

Donyell Malen and Nikola Krstović are the two top scorers in Serie A in the 2026 calendar year: 10 goals for the former, 7 for the latter (level with Douvikas and Lautaro Martínez).

Donyell Malen on the scoresheet against Pisa: he had not scored a hat-trick since PSV vs Oss in 2017/18 (Keuken Kampioen Divisie, the Dutch second division), while he did net five in PSV vs Vitesse (Eredivisie) in 2019/20.

Charles De Ketelaere is the 2025/26 Serie A midfielder with the most touches in the opposition penalty area (100).

Only Lautaro Martínez (14.98) and Moise Kean (13.5) produce more xG than Nikola Krstović (12.9) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Marco Carnesecchi is one of 6 players who has not missed a single minute in the 2025/26 Serie A season: 32 appearances out of 32 and 2,880 minutes on the pitch, excluding stoppage time – along with Svilar, Falcone, Butez, Caprile and De Gea.



CREMONESE



TORINO

The head-to-head record in Cremona stands at 11 meetings: 3 Grigiorossi wins (the most recent 3-2, Serie B 1998/99), 4 draws (the most recent 1-1, Serie B 1996/97) and 4 Granata victories (the most recent 1-2, Serie A 2022/23).

Cremonese have not won at home since 7 December, a 2-0 victory over Lecce; since then, 3 draws and 5 defeats in the following 8 home matches.

The two sides that attempt the fewest dribbles in the 2025/26 Serie A season go head-to-head: Cremonese (276) and Torino (335).

Only Lecce (26.9) produce less xG than Cremonese (30.8) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Only Pisa (58) and Verona (55) concede more goals in the 2025/26 Serie A season than Torino (54).

Torino are the 2025/26 Serie A side that concedes the most goals in the opening 15 minutes of the second half (9, level with Genoa, Como and Fiorentina).

Torino are the 2025/26 Serie A side with the highest ground duel-winning percentage (52.7%).

Torino are the 2025/26 Serie A side with the fewest different goalscorers (10, level with Verona).

Cremonese have collected just three points in their last 7 Serie A matchdays: their last win dates back to 21/03/2026, a 0-2 away victory at Parma.

Torino have recorded three wins and one defeat in their last 4 Serie A matchdays: 9 points collected in the period.

This is the first official meeting between Marco Giampaolo and Roberto D'Aversa: the Grigiorossi manager leads with 2 wins and 1 draw from their previous encounters.

Marco Giampaolo is a former manager of today's opponents: he led the Granata from July 2020 to January 2021, with a record of 4 wins, 8 draws and 9 defeats in 21 official matches.

Giovanni Simeone on the scoresheet against Verona: his 9th goal of the campaign, and his 4th in his last 5 Serie A 2025/26 appearances.



CREMONESE



TORINO

Cesare Casadei on the scoresheet against Verona: his 5th goal of the campaign. The Torino midfielder is the top Italian scorer in 2026 (5, level with Pio Esposito).



The head-to-head record in Veneto stands at 38 meetings: 11 Verona wins (the most recent 3-0, Serie A 2017/18), 12 draws (the most recent 1-1, Serie A 2000/01) and 15 Milan victories (the most recent 0-1, Serie A 2024/25).

Milan are on a run of 6 consecutive wins at the Bentegodi: Verona's last positive result at home goes back to 17 December 2017, a 3-0 victory in Serie A (Caracciolo, Kean and Bessa).

Only Lecce (8) score fewer second-half goals than Verona (9) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Verona are the 2025/26 Serie A side that has committed the most fouls (510) and received the most yellow cards (71).

Verona are the 2025/26 Serie A side with the fewest different goalscorers (10, level with Torino).

Only Pisa (58) concede more goals than Verona (55) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Only Pisa (693) win more aerial duels than Verona (675) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Milan are one of two sides in the 2025/26 Serie A season whose opponents have yet to be awarded a red card (along with Torino).

Milan are the 2025/26 Serie A side that earns the most points from losing positions (14).

Milan are one of two sides in the 2025/26 Serie A season that concede the fewest second-half goals (14, level with Atalanta).

Only Bologna (65) are caught offside more often than Milan (63) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

This is the first official meeting between Paolo Sammarco and Massimiliano Allegri.

Amin Sarr (22, level with Konan N'Dri) is the player who has come off the bench the most times in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Only Manuel Locatelli (983) completes more forward passes than Luka Modrić (797) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Only Kenan Yildiz (91) completes more dribbles than Alexis Saelemaekers (78) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.



The two Tuscan sides have faced each other 18 times: 8 wins for the Nerazzurri (the last a 2-0 victory in the 1991/92 Coppa Italia), 7 draws (the last a 2-2 draw in the 2000/01 Coppa Italia), and 3 wins for Genoa (the last a 0-1 victory in Serie B 2022/23).

The last Serie A clash between the two sides in Pisa dates back to 23 September 1990, Pisa vs Genoa 0-0.

Pisa have suffered 6 defeats without scoring in their last 7 matches. Their only positive result at home came on 15 March 2026 (Pisa v Cagliari 3-1, Serie A 2025/26).

Pisa have not scored for 306 minutes. The Nerazzurri's last goal was scored by Caracciolo in the 54th minute of Pisa 3-1 Cagliari on 15 March 2026.

Pisa are one of the three teams in the 2025/26 Serie A season to have conceded the most goals from opposing substitutes (11, alongside Lecce and Verona).

Pisa are the 2025/26 Serie A side who have conceded the most goals (58).

Pisa are the 2025/26 Serie A side who win the most duels per match (21.6).

Only Inter (264) and Atalanta (188) complete more crosses than Pisa (179) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Facing each other are the two teams in the 2025/26 Serie A season that have been awarded the most penalties: 8 for Genoa and 7 for Pisa (along with Como and Milan).

Genoa are one of the four teams in the 2025/26 Serie A season to concede the most goals in the first 15 minutes of the second half (9, along with Fiorentina, Como and Torino).

This is the first official meeting between Oscar Hiljemark and Daniele De Rossi.

Only Ylber Ramadani (167) and Filippo Terracciano (162) **have made more interceptions than Antonio Caracciolo (157)** in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Only Mateo Pellegrino (5) **has scored more headed goals in the 2025/26 Serie A season than Leo Ostigard** (4, the same as Lautaro Martinez).

Johan Vasquez is the outfield player with the most minutes played in the 2025/26 Serie A season (2857'), excluding injury time.

**PISA****GENOA**

No player has been substituted more times than Lorenzo Colombo (24) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Ruslan Malinovskyi scored against Sassuolo: his sixth goal of the season. The Ukrainian midfielder had not scored since 7 February 2026 (Genoa 2-3 Napoli).

Caleb Ekuban scores against Sassuolo: his fourth goal of the season. The Ghanaian striker had not scored since 22 February 2026 (Genoa 3-0 Torino).



The official head-to-head record between the two sides in Turin stands at 87 meetings: 51 Juventus wins (the most recent 3-0, Serie A 2022/23), 30 draws (the most recent 2-2, Serie A 2024/25) and 6 Bologna victories (the most recent 0-2, Serie A 2010/11).

Juventus have scored in 14 consecutive official home matches against the Rossoblù: a total of 28 goals in those fixtures. Their last scoreless home game against Bologna was the 0-2 defeat on 26 February 2011 (a Marco Di Vaio brace).

Juventus are on a run of 6 consecutive unbeaten Serie A matches: 4 wins and 2 draws, with their last defeat the 0-2 home loss to Como on 21 February. The Bianconeri have gone 218 minutes without conceding (since the 52nd minute of Juventus 1-1 Sassuolo, Pinamonti's goal).

Juventus are the top points-earning side in the second half of matches in the 2025/26 Serie A season: a balance of +15 for the Bianconeri, level with Milan. Moreover, 25 of Juventus's total 55 goals have come from the 61st minute onwards.

Juventus are the 2025/26 Serie A side with the fewest yellow cards received (41).

Only Inter (43) score more second-half goals than Juventus (34) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Juventus are the 2025/26 Serie A side that completes the most dribbles per match (10.5).

Juventus are the 2025/26 Serie A side that attempts the most shots from outside the penalty area per match (5.6).

Bologna are the 2025/26 Serie A side that makes the most substitutions (159 out of 160).

This is the 7th official meeting between Luciano Spalletti and Vincenzo Italiano: across the previous 6 encounters, 3 wins for the Juventus head coach, 1 for the Bologna manager and 2 draws.

Only Federico Dimarco (75) creates more chances than Kenan Yildiz (64) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

No player wins more tackles than Manuel Locatelli (69) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

No player in the 2025/26 Serie A season has missed more penalties than Riccardo Orsolini (2, level with Nico Paz).



No player in the 2025/26 Serie A season has hit the woodwork more times than Riccardo Orsolini (6).

Only Marco Palestra (100) and Mattia Zaccagni (79) have been fouled more times than Nicolò Cambiagli (66) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Jeremie Boga on the scoresheet against Atalanta: his 4th goal of the campaign and his 4th goal in his last 5 appearances for the Bianconeri.

Remo Freuler on the scoresheet against Lecce: his 1st goal of the campaign. The Swiss midfielder had not scored in Serie A since 4 May 2025 (Bologna 1-1 Juventus).

Riccardo Orsolini on the scoresheet against Lecce: his 8th goal of the campaign. The Italian winger had not scored in Serie A since 15 January 2026 (Verona 2-3 Bologna).



LECCE



FIorentINA

There have been 22 official matches between the two sides in Lecce: 8 wins for the Giallorossi (the most recent a 3-2 victory in the 2023/24 Serie A season), 8 draws (the most recent a 1-1 draw in the 2022/23 Serie A season) and 6 wins for the Viola (the most recent a 0-6 victory in the 2024/25 Serie A season).

Lecce are the Serie A 2025/26 side with the fewest goals scored (21) over the last two seasons; curiously, however, the side with the worst attack has always avoided relegation at the end of the season: Lecce themselves in 2024/25 (27 goals after 38 games) and Empoli in 2023/24 (29 goals after 38 games). Looking across the top five European leagues, Lecce remains the team that has scored the fewest goals, at least two goals behind any other side. The five teams with 23 goals or fewer are Pisa, Verona, Parma, Auxerre (29 games played) and Lecce themselves.

Only Genoa (46.3%) have a lower percentage of duels won than Lecce (47.22%) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Lecce are coming off the back of four consecutive defeats: the only goal scored by the Salento side in these matches was Jamil Siebert's in the third minute of the game against Napoli. The Giallorossi have therefore gone 357 minutes without scoring.

Lecce are the 2025/26 Serie A side who have conceded the most goals from opposing substitutes (11), alongside Pisa and Verona.

A clash between the two teams with the lowest percentage of successful crosses in Serie A 2025/26: Fiorentina (21.01%) and Lecce (21.23%). Fiorentina are, however, among the top four for crosses attempted, whilst Lecce are among the bottom six.

Looking at the last 10 league matchdays, only Napoli and Inter (23 each) have picked up more points than Fiorentina (18, the same as Juventus, Como, Atalanta and Bologna).

Eusebio Di Francesco and Paolo Vanoli face off for the third time: in their two previous meetings (both from last season), the Fiorentina manager secured one win and one draw.

No one has won more duels than Tiago Gabriel (201, level with Victor Nelsson) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Konan N'Dri (22, the same as Sarr) is the player who has come on as a substitute most often during a match in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

**LECCE****FIorentINA**

Robin Gosens scores against Lazio: his third goal of the season, the German had not scored since 7 January, precisely against the Biancocelesti in the first-leg fixture.

Wladimiro Falcone and David De Gea are two of the 6 players – all goalkeepers – to have played every minute in the 2025/26 Serie A season: 32 appearances out of 32 and 2,880 minutes on the pitch, excluding stoppage time, alongside Svilar, Caprile, Butez and Carnesecchi.

Only Albert Guðmundsson (4) has registered more assists than Jack Harrison for Fiorentina in the 2025/26 Serie A season. Since the Englishman arrived in Italy (his debut came on 24 January against Cagliari), only Dimarco (6), Da Cunha, Laurienté, Conceição and Zaniolo (4) have recorded more assists than him in Serie A.

No player in the 2025/26 Serie A season has recorded a greater negative difference between xG (14.98) and goals scored (8) than Moise Kean: -6.98.
