



# INSIGHTS - MATCHDAY 38

SERIE A 2025/2026



FIorentINA



ATALANTA

**The official head-to-head record between the two sides in Tuscany stands at 73 meetings:** 46 Fiorentina wins (the most recent 1-0, Serie A 2024/25), 17 draws (the most recent 1-1, Serie A 2022/23) and 10 Atalanta victories (the most recent 2-3, Serie A 2020/21).

**Fiorentina have scored in each of their last 11 home matches against the Bergamo side:** a total of 18 goals, with the last blank dating back to 16 October 2016 (Fiorentina 0-0 Atalanta, Serie A). Conversely, Atalanta have not scored in Florence for 217 minutes: their last goal there was scored by Ademola Lookman on 17 September 2023 (Fiorentina 3-2 Atalanta, Serie A).

**Fiorentina without a double-figure scorer:** it had not been since the 2022/23 season that the Viola ended a campaign without a player reaching double figures (Kean their top scorer with 8 goals; back then it was Cabral, also on 8).

**Fiorentina sit on 41 points after 37 matchdays:** they have not had so few since the 2020/21 season, when the Viola finished on 40 points in 13th place.

**Fiorentina have suffered just one defeat in their last 10 Serie A matchdays:** 4 wins and 5 draws, with the only loss coming against Roma (4-0 on 4 May). Fiorentina have kept a clean sheet for 212 minutes: the last goal they conceded was scored by Pisilli in the 58th minute of Roma 4-0 Fiorentina.

**No side in the 2025/26 Serie A season has dropped more points from winning positions than Fiorentina (24).**

**No side in the 2025/26 Serie A season has conceded more headed goals than Fiorentina (15),** and only Genoa (21) have conceded more set-piece goals than the Viola (18).

**A fourth consecutive European qualification for Atalanta:** the Nerazzurri will enter at the preliminary rounds of the Conference League, competing for a place in the group stage of Europe's third-tier competition. Since their first European qualification under Gasperini at the end of the 2016/17 season, the only campaign in which they have missed out was 2021/22 (8th place with 59 points).

**Two double-figure scorers for Atalanta:** both Krstović and Scamacca reach 10 goals. It is the 8th consecutive season in which the Nerazzurri finish with two players reaching at least 10 goals.

**Only Inter (13) and Juventus (11) have scored more goals through substitutes than Atalanta (10, level with Como) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.**

**This is the fourth official meeting between Paolo Vanoli and Raffaele Palladino:** in the three previous encounters, the Atalanta manager has secured two wins and one draw.

**Raffaele Palladino is the former manager of the day:** during the 2024/25 season, he managed Fiorentina in 51 official matches, recording 24 wins, 14 draws and 13 defeats.

**David De Gea and Marco Carnesecchi**, with 37 appearances out of 37 and 3,330 minutes on the pitch, **are two of the six players who have played every available minute in the 2025/26 Serie A season.** The others are Butez (Como), Caprile (Cagliari), Svilar (Roma) and Falcone (Lecce).

**Rolando Mandragora scored against Juventus:** his fourth league goal from outside the box; only Piotr Zieliński and Hakan Çalhanoglu have scored more (five each).

Only Ruslan Malinovskyi (27) **has attempted more shots from set pieces than Rolando Mandragora** (23, the same as Nico Paz) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Only Wladimiro Falcone (89) **has made more saves from shots fired from inside the box than Marco Carnesecchi** (81) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

No player in the 2025/26 Serie A **season has attempted more passes into the box than Charles De Ketelaere** (114).

**There have been 91 previous meetings between the two sides in Emilia:** the record stands at 36 wins for the Rossoblù (most recent 1-0, Serie A 2024/25), 16 draws (most recent 1-1, Serie A 2017/18) and 39 wins for the Nerazzurri (most recent 0-1, Serie A 2023/24).

**Inter have won two of their last eight matches against Bologna across Serie A, Coppa Italia and Supercoppa Italiana:** the record is completed by 4 draws (two of which turned into defeats after normal time: one in extra time in the 2023/24 Coppa Italia and the other on penalties in the 2025/26 Supercoppa Italiana) and 2 defeats.

**Bologna have won 3 of their last 4 matches against Inter at the Dall'Ara:** Inter's only victory was Bologna 0-1 Inter in the 2023/24 Serie A season.

**Lautaro Martinez is the top scorer in matches between Bologna and Inter at the Dall'Ara,** with 5 goals (jointly with Roberto Boninsegna).

**Bologna have recorded just 1 win in their last 7 official home matches:** Bologna 2-0 Lecce, 12 April, Serie A.

**Bologna have recorded 3 consecutive positive results in Serie A (2 wins and 1 draw):** this is the third time this has happened in this season's league campaign (the other two runs: 9 between September and November and 3 between February and March).

**Bologna** are the 2025/26 Serie A side **making the most substitutions:** (183 out of 185 available, level with Como).

**Bologna** are the 2025/26 Serie A side **averaging the most long passes (78.8).**

Only Juventus (4.73) and Inter (4.7) **average more crosses from open play than Bologna (3.7) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.**

**Inter are on a run of nine consecutive positive results in Serie A** (five wins and four draws): this is the longest ongoing run in the league.

**Inter** are the team in the 2025/26 Serie A season **with the highest average number of shots from corners (2.8).**

**Inter** are the team in the 2025/26 Serie A season **with the highest average number of offensive recoveries (15.8).**

**Inter** are the team in the 2025/26 Serie A **season to have benefited from the most own goals in their favour (4).**

**This is the 4th official meeting between Vincenzo Italiano and Cristian Chivu:** across the previous 3 encounters, 2 wins for the Nerazzurri manager and 1 draw.

**Riccardo Orsolini on the scoresheet against Atalanta:** the Bologna winger's 10th goal of the campaign. This is the 4th consecutive season in which he has reached double figures, having never surpassed 8 goals in the previous 5 seasons (in 2018/19 and 2019/20).

**Federico Dimarco (83) is the 2025/26 Serie A player with the most key passes.** In 3rd place is Nicolò Barella (65).



**The official head-to-head record between the two sides in Rome stands at 7 meetings: 3** Roman wins (the most recent 1-0, Serie A 1988/89), 3 draws (the most recent 0-0, Serie A 1990/91) and 1 Tuscan victory (the most recent 0-1, Serie A 1983/84).

**Pisa have gone 321 minutes without scoring at the Olimpico, on the Lazio side.** Their last goal there dates back to 8 January 1984 (0-1, Vianello in the 39th minute, Serie A).

**Lazio have not finished a Serie A season with fewer points since 2009/10**, when they ended the 38-matchday campaign on 46 points. Today the Biancocelesti sit on 51, with one match still to play.

**Lazio are the 2025/26 Serie A side that concedes the most passes in the defensive half per match (317.6).**

**Lazio are the 2025/26 Serie A side that scores the most goals in second-half stoppage time (8).**

**Lazio are the 2025/26 Serie A side with the most red cards received (9).**

**The two sides that win and lose the most duels per match in the 2025/26 Serie A season go head-to-head: Pisa (1st, 37.9) and Lazio (20th, 26.5).**

**Pisa have been mathematically relegated to Serie B.** It is since the 1987/88 and 1988/89 seasons that the Nerazzurri have not played two consecutive seasons in Serie A.

**Pisa are the 2025/26 Serie A side that concedes the most goals from opposition substitutes (13).**

**Pisa are the 2025/26 Serie A side that concedes the most goals inside the penalty area (59).**

**Pisa are the 2025/26 Serie A side that falls behind first the most times (24, level with Verona).**

**Pisa are the 2025/26 Serie A side with the fewest clean sheets (5).**

**Pisa are the only side in the 2025/26 Serie A season without an away win.** Their last away victory in Serie A dates back to March 1991 (Parma 2-3 Pisa). Should they fail to win against Lazio as well, it would be the first ever top-flight season in Pisa's history without an away victory.



**Pisa have gone 214 minutes without scoring.** Their last goal dates back to 1 May 2026 (Pisa 1-2 Lecce, Leris in the 56th minute).

**Pisa are coming off the back of eight consecutive defeats.** Their last win dates back to 15 March 2026 (Pisa 3-1 Cagliari, Serie A). This is the longest current losing run in Europe's top five leagues.

**This is the first official meeting between Maurizio Sarri and Oscar Hiljemark.**

**No player has scored more goals as a substitute than Tijjani Noslin (4)** in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

**Lazio's top scorer in the 2025/26 Serie A season is Gustav Isaksen with 5 goals.** In 2023/24, too, the Biancocelesti finished the season without a single player reaching double figures (at that time, the top scorer was Ciro Immobile with 7 goals).



PARMA

**The 7th Emilian derby at the Tardini:** across the previous 6 meetings, 3 Parma wins (the most recent 1-0, Serie A 2019/20), 1 draw (the most recent 1-1, Serie B 2008/09) and 2 Sassuolo victories (the most recent 1-3, Serie A 2020/21).

**Parma are on course for their worst-ever goals-scored total in a Serie A season:** heading into the final matchday they stand on 27 goals, with the all-time low being 32, set in 1991/92.

**Parma are the 2025/26 Serie A side that benefits from the most opposition red cards (7).**

**The two sides that have conceded the most open-play crosses per match in the 2025/26 Serie A season go head-to-head:** Parma (20.54) and Sassuolo (17.59).

**The two sides sit at opposite ends of the spectrum, however, when it comes to goals conceded from open-play crosses:** no side has conceded more than Sassuolo (12, level with Cagliari, Torino and Pisa), while only Como (3) and Roma (2) have conceded fewer than Parma (5, level with Atalanta).

**Only Verona (206) and Cremonese (190) have conceded more shots from outside the penalty area than Sassuolo (186) and Parma (181).**

**Only Cagliari and Milan (both 14) have earned more points from losing positions than Sassuolo (13, level with Napoli).**

**This is the 2nd official meeting between Carlos Cuesta and Fabio Grosso:** the first leg ended 1-1 in Reggio Emilia.

**Mateo Pellegrino (8) is Parma's top scorer in the 2025/26 Serie A season.** It has not been since the 2019/20 season that a Parma player has finished a top-flight campaign in double figures (Cornelius 12 and Kulusevski 10 on that occasion).

**Mateo Pellegrino leads in several categories in the 2025/26 Serie A season:** 1st for total duels contested (536), headed goals scored (5) and fouls committed (83).

**Armand Laurienté on the scoresheet against Lecce:** his 7th league goal of the season. Only Federico Dimarco (18) has accumulated more assists than the Frenchman (9) in this Serie A campaign.

**Andrea Pinamonti on the scoresheet against Lecce:** his 9th of the season, making him Sassuolo's top scorer. No Neroverde has finished a campaign without a double-figure scorer since 2018/19 (Berardi, 8).

**There have been 49 previous official matches between the two sides in Campania**, with Napoli recording 31 wins (most recent 4-1, Serie A 2023/24), 13 draws (most recent 1-1, Serie A 2024/25) and Udinese securing 5 victories (most recent 1-2, Serie A 2010/11).

**Napoli have qualified for the Champions League for the 13th time in their history** (including the European Cup).

**Napoli** are the 2025/26 Serie A side **with the most different goalscorers (19)**.

**Napoli** are the 2025/26 Serie A side **conceding the most penalties (10)**.

Only Milan and Cagliari (14) **have come from behind to win more matches than Napoli** (13, level with Sassuolo) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Only Inter (25) and Genoa (17) **have scored more goals from set-pieces than Napoli** (16, level with Roma and Milan) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Only Juventus (10.8) and Milan (9.7) **complete more dribbles per match than Udinese (9.5)** in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

**Udinese** are the 2025/26 Serie A side **with the highest percentage of duels won in their defensive half (61.8%, level with Roma)**.

Only Torino and Pisa (11) **have conceded more goals in the first 15 minutes of the second half against Udinese** (10, level with Fiorentina, Cagliari and Genoa) in the 2025/26 Serie A season

**Udinese** are the 2025/26 Serie A side **who have scored the fewest goals through substitutes (2)**.

**This is the 4th official meeting between Antonio Conte and Kosta Runjaic**: one win apiece and one draw.

**No one engages in more ground duels than Rasmus Højlund (187)** in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

**Rasmus Højlund scores against Pisa**: the Danish striker's 11th goal in this league campaign. It is his personal best in a single league season in terms of goals scored.

**Amir Rrahmani scores against Pisa**: 2nd goal in this league for the Kosovar defender. He had not scored in Serie A since 4 January 2026 in Lazio v Napoli (0-2).

**Scott McTominay scores against Pisa:** 10th goal in this league for the Scottish midfielder, 3rd goal in the last 6 matches.



**The official head-to-head record between the two sides in Turin, on the Granata side, stands at 89 meetings:** 24 Torino wins (the most recent 2-1, Serie A 2014/15), 28 draws (the most recent 1-1, last season's Serie A) and 37 Juventus victories (the most recent 0-1, Serie A 2022/23).

**Torino's last derby win dates back to 26 April 2015,** a 2-1 comeback victory with goals from Darmian and Quagliarella, after Pirlo had given Juventus the lead. In the subsequent 10 derbies: 3 draws and 7 Bianconeri wins.

**Torino are unbeaten at home since D'Aversa's arrival:** 4 wins and 1 draw.

Torino have conceded 61 goals in total across 37 matchdays. **In the last five seasons, only in 2020/21 did the Granata finish the campaign having conceded more: 69 on that occasion.**

**Torino are one point away from surpassing their final total of 44 points from last season.**

**In each of his last 6 Serie A seasons as a manager, Luciano Spalletti has always secured Champions League qualification.** This would be the Juventus manager's first season ending without qualification to Europe's premier competition since 2008/09, when he was in charge of Roma.

**Since the season following Juventus's last league title, the Bianconeri have accumulated a 100-point gap behind the leaders.** Looking at individual seasons, only in 2023/24 did they register a larger points deficit behind the top side (23) than this season (18).

**From the 2012/13 season onwards, Juventus have always finished in a position that guaranteed Champions League qualification for the following season.** Only in 2023/24 were they unable to compete in Europe's top competition, due to a 10-point deduction that negated their 3rd-place finish (72 points, level with Inter).

**Juventus are unbeaten in 5 consecutive away matches,** with 3 wins and 2 draws. Their last defeat was a 2-5 loss on 17 February in Istanbul against Galatasaray.

**The Bianconeri have kept a clean sheet for 385 minutes:** the last goal they conceded was scored by Malen in the 65th minute of Roma 3-3 Juventus on 1 March.

**This is the 5th official meeting between Roberto D'Aversa and Luciano Spalletti:** the Juventus manager leads 3-1.



**With 11 goals, Giovanni Simeone is Torino's top scorer this season.** It is the fifth time the former Napoli striker has reached double figures in the Italian top flight – and the first time since 2021/22, when he scored 17.

**Only Federico Dimarco (85) creates more chances than Kenan Yildiz (69) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.**

**Only Morten Frendrup (83) and Santiago Pierotti (79) win more tackles than Manuel Locatelli (76) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.**



**In Milan, the two sides have met 47 times:** the record stands at 32 Rossoneri wins (most recent 5-1, Serie A 2023/24), 11 draws (most recent 1-1, Serie A 2024/25) and 4 Sardinian victories (most recent 0-1, Serie A 1996/97).

**Cagliari are on a run of 22 consecutive matches without a win against Milan at San Siro across Serie A and the Coppa Italia** (3 draws and 19 defeats, conceding 54 goals and scoring 15): the Rossoblù's last victory dates back to 1 June 1997, Milan 0-1 Cagliari, Serie A.

**Milan are on a run of 16 consecutive positive results against Cagliari across Serie A and the Coppa Italia** (at San Siro and the Unipol Domus): 12 wins and 4 draws. The Sardinians' last victory against the Rossoneri came on 28 May 2017, Cagliari 2-1 Milan, Serie A.

**Among the players currently in the Milan and Cagliari squads, the top scorer in these fixtures** (at San Siro and the Unipol Domus) is Rafael Leão, with 7 goals. Furthermore, the Portuguese forward is in 2nd place overall in this special ranking: only Luigi Riva, with 11 goals, has done better.

**Milan are coming off a win at Marassi against Genoa:** the Rossoneri's worst run of form in this league (three consecutive games without a win) has been snapped.

**Milan are coming off the back of scoring two goals away from home:** this hasn't happened since 1 March 2026 in Cremonese v Milan 0-2, Serie A.

**Milan are coming off the back of two consecutive matches in which they have scored at least two goals per game:** this hasn't happened since February (Bologna v Milan 0-3 and Pisa v Milan 1-2).

**Milan's top scorer in the 2025/26 Serie A season is Rafael Leão, with 9 goals.** The last time the Rossoneri had no player in double figures in Serie A was in the 2018/19 season, with Krzysztof Piatek, also on 9 goals.

Only Juventus (17.2) **attempts more dribbles on average than Milan (15.5)** in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Only Inter (25) and Genoa (17) **score more goals than Milan (16, the same as Napoli and Roma)** from set-pieces in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

**Milan** are the Serie A 2025/26 side who **have gained the most points in the second half compared to their first-half results (+17).**



**Second official meeting between Massimiliano Allegri and Fabio Pisacane:** in their only previous encounter, the first leg, the Rossoneri manager secured a 1-0 victory.

**Massimiliano Allegri, the day's former manager:** he managed the Rossoblù from July 2008 to April 2010. His record stands at 27 wins, 15 draws and 32 defeats in 74 competitive matches.

**The two Serie A 2025/26 sides facing off have recovered the most points from behind (14 each).**

**Cagliari** are the Serie A 2025/26 side **averaging the most defensive recoveries (39.3).**

**Christopher Nkunku scores against Genoa:** the French forward's 7th goal in Serie A. He has scored 5 goals from the penalty spot, the most in the league (jointly with Nikola Vlasic).

**Sebastiano Esposito scored against Torino:** the Rossoblù forward's 7th goal in this league campaign. It is his second-best season in terms of goals (he only did better in 2024/25, scoring 8 goals for Empoli in Serie A).

**Elia Caprile, with 37 appearances out of 37 and 3,330 minutes on the pitch, is one of six players to have played every available minute in the 2025/26 Serie A season.** The others are Butez (Como), De Gea (Fiorentina), Svilar (Roma), Falcone (Lecce) and Carnesecchi (Atalanta).

**Michel Adopo is one of four outfield players in the 2025/26 Serie A season to have made 37 appearances out of 37:** the others are Laurientè (Sassuolo), Douvikas (Como) and Colombo (Genoa).



**The official head-to-head record in Cremona stands at 29 meetings:** 17 Grigiorossi wins (the most recent 2-1, Serie B 2023/24), 7 draws (the most recent 2-2, Lega Pro Prima Divisione 2010/11) and 5 Como victories (the most recent 0-1, Lega Pro Prima Divisione 2013/14).

**In Serie A, the fixture between the two sides at the Zini has not been played since 31 March 1985** (Cremonese 2-0 Como, goals from Finardi from the spot and Juary).

**Historically, Cremonese vs Como has twice been a match of decisive verdicts.** In 1982/83, in Serie B, the two sides finished level in third place alongside Catania, leading to a three-way playoff to determine the third side promoted to Serie A behind Milan and Lazio. The clash between the two Lombard clubs ended 0-0 in Rome, and it was Catania who went up, beating Como 1-0. More recently, on 6 May 2022, again in Serie B, Cremonese won 1-2 at the Sinigaglia on the final matchday to leapfrog Monza – beaten 0-1 in Perugia – and celebrate direct promotion to Serie A, from which they had been absent since the 1995/96 season.

**Cremonese are fighting for survival:** it has not been since the 1993/94–1995/96 period that the Grigiorossi have remained in Serie A for at least two consecutive seasons. Giampaolo's side must necessarily overtake Lecce to be safe: level on points, a playoff on neutral ground would be required, even though Cremonese hold the head-to-head advantage (2-0 at home, 2-1 to Lecce at the Via del Mare).

Should both Cremonese and Lecce win, **the Grigiorossi would finish third from bottom on 37 points.** To find a relegated side with a higher points total in Serie A, you would have to go back to 2018/19, when Empoli went down on 38 points – level with Genoa, who stayed up by virtue of a superior head-to-head record.

**Cremonese are the 2025/26 Serie A side with the highest percentage of time spent behind on the scoreboard (35.04%).**

**Cremonese are the 2025/26 Serie A side that concedes the most shots on target per match (5).**

**Cremonese are the 2025/26 Serie A side with the highest shots-on-target percentage conceded (36.4%).**

**Como are the 2025/26 Serie A side with the highest aerial duel-winning percentage (57.2%).**

**Como are the 2025/26 Serie A side with the highest ball possession percentage (60.5%).**

**Como are the 2025/26 Serie A side with the most clean sheets (19).**



**Como are the 2025/26 Serie A side that makes the most substitutions** (183, level with Bologna).

**A record-breaking season for Como:** 19 Serie A wins, a new all-time club record in the top flight (the previous record was 18, set in 1950/51).

**This is the 3rd official meeting between Marco Giampaolo and Cesc Fàbregas**, following their two encounters in the 2025/26 Serie A season in the Lecce vs Como double header – both won by the Lariani.

**Only Ylber Ramadani** (188) **makes more interceptions than Filippo Terracciano** (185) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

**Emil Audero leads in several categories in the 2025/26 Serie A season:** 1st for total saves (123), 1st for completed long passes (355) and 1st for saves from shots outside the penalty area (47).

**The two goalkeepers who complete the most forward passes in the defensive half in the 2025/26 Serie A season go head-to-head:** Jean Butez (796) and Emil Audero (610).

**No player attempts more shots on target than Nico Paz** (46) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

**Jean Butez**, with 37 appearances out of 37 and 3,330 minutes on the pitch, **is one of 6 players to have played every available minute in the 2025/26 Serie A season** – alongside Falcone (Lecce), De Gea (Fiorentina), Svilar (Roma), Caprile (Cagliari) and Carnesecchi (Atalanta).

**Anastasios Douvikas is one of 4 outfield players to have made 37 appearances out of 37** – alongside Adopo (Cagliari), Laurienté (Sassuolo) and Colombo (Genoa).



**The official head-to-head record between the two sides in Lecce stands at 20 meetings:** 11 Salentini wins (the most recent 1-0, Serie A 2023/24), 5 draws (the most recent 0-0, Serie A 2024/25) and 4 Rossoblù victories (the most recent 1-3, Serie A 2010/11).

**Lecce have collected 6 points in their last 3 matches:** their best run of the season with 2 wins and 1 defeat (matching the period 01/02–16/02).

**Genoa have collected 5 points in their last 5 matches:** 1 win, 2 draws and 2 defeats for the Rossoblù, with just 3 goals scored in those 5 matchdays.

**A Genoa win would see them surpass their total points tally from last season:** the Rossoblù currently sit on 41 and, with a victory, would move to 44, beyond the 43 accumulated last year.

**The side that has taken the fewest penalties in Serie A and the side that has taken the most go head-to-head at the Via del Mare:** 2 for Lecce (level with Parma and Cagliari), 9 for Genoa (level with Milan).

**Lecce are the 2025/26 Serie A side that concedes the fewest goals in the opening 15 minutes of matches** (2, level with Inter).

**Only Inter (16) score more goals than Genoa between the 76th and 90th minute** (10, level with Milan and Como).

**Genoa are the 2025/26 Serie A side that concedes the fewest goals in the final 15 minutes of matches, excluding stoppage time** (2, level with Bologna).

**This is the 2nd official meeting between Eusebio Di Francesco and Daniele De Rossi:** the only previous encounter dates back to the 2023/24 Serie A season (Frosinone 0-3 Roma).

**The two players who have come off the bench the most times in the 2025/26 Serie A season go head-to-head at the Via del Mare:** 25 each for Konan N'Dri and Caleb Ekuban.

**Lorenzo Colombo (28) is the player who has been substituted the most times** in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

**Lorenzo Colombo is the player who has made the most appearances in the 2025/26 Serie A season:** 37 out of 37 for the Genoa striker – alongside Adopo (Cagliari), Douvikas (Como) and Laurienté (Sassuolo).



LECCE

**Only Alessio Romagnoli (1,581) has completed more passes in the defensive half than Johan Vásquez (1,515) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.**

Only Riccardo Orsolini (6) **has scored more goals from set pieces than Ruslan Malinovskyi (5, level with Lautaro Martinez, Christopher Nkunku and Nikola Vlasic) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.**

Only Federico Dimarco (314) and Emanuele Valeri (255) **have delivered more crosses than Aaron Martin (204) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.**

**Walid Cheddira scored against Sassuolo:** his fourth goal of the season. The Moroccan striker has scored a total of three goals in his last three Serie A matches.

**Nikola Stulic scored against Sassuolo:** his fourth goal of the season. The Serbian striker had not scored since 8 March 2026 (Lecce v Cremonese, 2-1). Three of his four goals this season have proved decisive for the Salento side, directly contributing to three victories.

**Johan Vásquez scored against Milan:** his first goal of the season. The Genoa defender and captain had not scored since 11 May 2025 (Napoli v Genoa, 2-2 in the 2024/25 Serie A season).



**There have been 39 previous meetings in Verona:** the record stands at 12 wins for Verona (most recent 3-2, Serie A 2024/25), 14 draws (most recent 1-1, in Serie A 2015/16) and 13 wins for Roma (most recent 1-3, in Serie A 2022/23).

**Verona have won four of the last five meetings at the Bentegodi;** Roma's last victory there was on 31 October 2022 (1-3).

**Roma have not competed in the Champions League since the 2018/19 season and have played in Europe's top competition 13 times in their history** (including the old European Cup).

**Verona** are the 2025/26 Serie A side **with the fewest different goalscorers (10).**

Only Pisa (69) and Torino (61) **have conceded more goals than Verona (59)** in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

**Verona** are the 2025/26 Serie A side who **have scored the fewest goals in the second half (10).**

**Verona** is the 2025/26 Serie A **team that commits the most fouls on average (15.8) and receives the most yellow cards (82).**

**Verona (7, like Pisa) are the 2025/26 Serie A side who concede the most goals in second-half stoppage time.**

Only Como (19) and Inter (18) **have kept a clean sheet more times than Roma (17)** in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Only Inter (15.8) **make more offensive recoveries on average than Roma (14.5)** in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

**Verona are on a run of nine consecutive games without a win:** a record of three draws and six defeats. Their last victory was on 8 March 2026, Bologna 1-2 Verona.

**Roma have recorded 5 wins and 1 draw in their last 6 matches.** Their last defeat came on 5 April 2026 against Inter (5-2).

**This is the first official meeting between Paolo Sammarco and Gian Piero Gasperini.**

**Mile Svilar**, with 37 appearances out of 37 and 3,330 minutes on the pitch, **is one of 6 players to have played every available minute in the 2025/26 Serie A season** – alongside Butez (Como), Caprile (Cagliari), De Gea (Fiorentina), Carnesecchi (Atalanta) and Falcone (Lecce).
