SERIE A 2025/2026



ROMA



PISA

The official head-to-head record in Rome between the two sides stands at 8 meetings: 7 Giallorossi wins (the most recent 2-1, Serie A 1988/89) and 1 Tuscan victory (0-2, Serie A 1990/91).

On the day of Pisa's only win in Rome, the Tuscan side were managed by Mircea Lucescu, who passed away last Tuesday at the age of 80.

Pisa arrive at the capital still without an away win in this Serie A campaign. Their last victory on the road in top-flight history dates back to 24 March 1991 (Parma 2-3 Pisa).

Roma are the 2025/26 Serie A side that concedes the fewest first-half goals (9, level with Como).

Roma are the 2025/26 Serie A side that has conceded the fewest penalties (1).

Only Inter (16.6) average more offensive recoveries per match than Roma (15.3) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Pisa are the 2025/26 Serie A side with the most goals conceded (55): they are also the side that concedes the most goals between the 31st minute and the end of first-half stoppage time (12).

Pisa are one of 3 sides in the 2025/26 Serie A season to have conceded the most goals from opposition substitutes (11, level with Verona and Lecce).

Only Inter (53%) have a higher duel-winning percentage than Pisa (52.5%) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Pisa are the 2025/26 Serie A side with the highest number of aerial duels won per match (21.7).

Pisa are the 2025/26 Serie A side with the fewest forward passes per match (167.8).

This is the first official meeting between Gian Piero Gasperini and Oscar Hiljemark.

Only Mateo Pellegrino (483) and Lorenzo Colombo (325) have contested more duels than Bryan Cristante (298) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.



ROMA



PISA

Lorenzo Pellegrini on the scoresheet against Inter: his 4th league goal of the season – he had not scored in Serie A since 25 January (Roma 1-1 Milan). It is also his 3rd career goal against the Nerazzurri across all competitions: he has only scored more against Udinese, Bologna and Lazio (4 each).

Gianluca Mancini on the scoresheet against Inter: the Roma defender's 1st league goal of the season; the Nerazzurri have become his favourite victim, with 4 goals against them. He had not scored in Serie A since 18 May 2025 (Roma 3-1 Milan).



The official head-to-head record between the two sides in Cagliari stands at 12 meetings: the Sardinians are unbeaten with 7 wins (the most recent 1-0, Coppa Italia 2024/25) and 5 draws (the most recent 0-0 in the 1993/94 Serie A season).

The last league match between Cagliari and Cremonese in Sardinia dates back to the 1995/96 Serie A season (1-0 to the Rossoblù, with the decisive goal scored by Luis Oliveira from the penalty spot).

This weekend marks the 56th anniversary of Cagliari's historic league title, which was clinched mathematically on 12 April 1970 with a 2-0 victory at the old Amsicora stadium against Bari.

Cagliari have picked up just two points in their last 8 Serie A matchdays: their last win came on 31/01/2026, a 4-0 victory over Verona.

Cremonese have scored in each of their last 4 matches. Only between September and November did they record a longer such run (6 games).

Cagliari are the side that has received the most yellow cards (69) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Cagliari are the side that has taken the fewest penalties (2, level with Lecce and Parma) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Only Inter (16), Juventus (11) and Napoli (9) have scored more headed goals than Cagliari (8, level with Roma and Parma) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Cagliari are the side with the most defensive recoveries (1,191) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Only Fiorentina (509) and Lazio (470) have conceded more fouls than Cagliari (469) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Only Torino (53.3%) and Fiorentina (52.68%) have a higher ground duel-winning percentage than Cremonese (52.12%) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Only Lecce (752) have recorded more defensive clearances than Cremonese (736) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

This is the first official meeting between Fabio Pisacane and Marco Giampaolo.



Marco Giampaolo is a former manager of today's hosts: he led the Islanders from July to December 2006 and from February to November 2007, accumulating 45 matches on the Rossoblù bench with a record of 12 wins, 15 draws and 18 defeats.

Only Federico Dimarco (96) **has delivered more crosses from corner kicks than Jari Vandeputte (65) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.**

Only Arijanet Muric (113) **has made more saves than Emil Audero (109) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.**

Sebastiano Esposito scored against Sassuolo: his 5th goal of the season, 2 goals in his last 3 matches. He is Cagliari's leading scorer in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Federico Bonazzoli scored against Bologna: his 7th goal this season, 2 goals in his last 4 matches. He is the top scorer for Cremonese in the 2025/26 Serie A season.



TORINO



VERONA

The head-to-head record between the two sides in Turin stands at 43 meetings: 19 Granata wins (the most recent 1-0, Serie A 2021/22), 18 draws (the most recent 1-1, Serie A 2024/25) and 6 Veneto victories (the most recent 0-1, Serie A 2014/15).

Verona have not won in Turin since 21 September 2014 (1-0 in Serie A, decisive goal from Ionita, with El Kaddouri missing a penalty that could have made it 1-1).

Torino are one of 2 sides in the 2025/26 Serie A season yet to be awarded a red card (along with Milan).

Torino are the 2025/26 Serie A side that concedes the most goals in the opening 15 minutes of the second half (9, level with Fiorentina).

Two of the three 2025/26 Serie A sides with the fewest different goalscorers go head-to-head (10, level with Parma).

Only Cremonese (267) attempt fewer dribbles than Torino (326) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Only Pisa (55) have conceded more goals in the 2025/26 Serie A season than Torino and Verona (both 53).

Only Pisa (673) win more aerial duels than Verona (654) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Only Cagliari (71) have received more yellow cards than Verona (69) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Only Lecce (8) score fewer second-half goals than Verona (9) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Verona have gone 303 minutes without a league goal: their last strike was scored by Kieron Bowie on 8 March 2026, in the 57th minute of Bologna 1-2 Verona.

This is the first official meeting between Roberto D'Aversa and Paolo Sammarco.

Amin Sarr (21, level with N'Dri) is the player who has come off the bench the most times in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Che Adams on the scoresheet against Pisa: his 5th goal of the campaign – he had not scored in Serie A since 1 February in Torino 1-0 Lecce.



MILAN



UDINESE

There have been 53 official matches between the two teams in Milan: Milan has 28 wins (the most recent 1-0, Serie A 2024/25), 17 draws (the most recent 1-1, Serie A 2021/22), and 8 wins for Udinese (the last 0-1, Serie A 2023/24).

On September 10, 1950, Milan 6-2 Udinese marked the Friulians' debut in the top division's single-round league: scoring that day were Liedholm, Annovazzi, Santagostino (two goals), Renosto, and Nordahl for the Rossoneri, and Perissinotto and Rinaldi for the Bianconeri.

Milan is the 2025/26 Serie A team that commits the most penalty fouls (8), along with Napoli.

Milan is the 2025/26 Serie A team that earns the most points while trailing (14).

Milan is the 2025/26 Serie A team that was caught offside the most times (63).

Milan is the 2025/26 Serie A team that made the fewest substitutions (123).

Milan is one of two 2025/26 Serie A teams without any red cards awarded in their favor (along with Torino).

Milan is one of the 3 teams in the 2025/26 Serie A season that conceded the fewest goals in the second half (13), along with Atalanta and Como.

Udinese is the 2025/26 Serie A team that scores the fewest goals with substitute players (2), like Verona.

Udinese has kept a clean sheet for 232 minutes. The last goal conceded was on March 14, 2026, by Boga (38' of Udinese-Juventus 0-1, Serie A).

Second official meeting between Massimiliano Allegri and Kosta Runjaic: the only previous encounter was the first leg, won 0-3 in Udine by the Rossoneri coach.

Only Manuel Locatelli (965) **completes more forward passes than Luka Modrić (768) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.**

Only Kenan Yildiz (90) **has completed more dribbles than Alexis Saelemaekers (76) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.**

Only Ylber Ramadani (83) **has made more offensive recoveries than Jesper Karlström (69) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.**



ATALANTA



JUVENTUS

The official head-to-head record between the two sides in Bergamo stands at 75 meetings: 13 Atalanta wins (the most recent 3-0, Coppa Italia on 5 February), 33 draws (the most recent 1-1, Serie A 2024/25) and 29 Juventus victories (the most recent 0-2, Serie A 2022/23).

Atalanta have won just 1 of their last 7 official home matches at the New Balance Arena against Juventus: the 3-0 in the Coppa Italia last 5 February. The remaining results consist of 3 draws and 3 Bianconeri wins.

Atalanta are on a run of 4 unbeaten matches against Juventus (at the New Balance Arena and the Allianz Stadium) across all competitions: 2 wins and 2 draws. The last time this happened was between 1990/91 and 1991/92 across Serie A and the Coppa Italia, with 4 consecutive draws.

From the 2019/20 season onwards, among players currently in the Atalanta and Juventus squads, Kamaldeen Sulemana is the top scorer in head-to-head clashes in Bergamo and Turin, with 2 goals – both scored this season, one in the first league meeting and the other in the Coppa Italia.

Atalanta have kept a clean sheet for 244 minutes: the last goal they conceded was scored by Francesco Pio Esposito in the 26th minute of Inter 1-1 Atalanta on 14 March.

Only Napoli (19) have used more different goalscorers than Juventus (18) and Atalanta (17, level with Cagliari) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Juventus are the 2025/26 Serie A side with the fewest yellow cards received (38).

Only Inter (69.2) have accumulated more xG than Juventus (61.1) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

This is the 3rd official meeting between Raffaele Palladino and Luciano Spalletti: the Atalanta head coach has won both previous encounters.

Since Luciano Spalletti's arrival at Juventus (matchday 10, Cremonese vs Juventus), only Inter (54), Milan (45) and Napoli (44) have earned more points than the Bianconeri (42, level with Como).

Since Raffaele Palladino's arrival at Atalanta (matchday 12, Napoli vs Atalanta), only Inter (14) and Milan (15) have conceded fewer goals than the Bergamo side (16, level with Como).



ATALANTA



JUVENTUS

Raffaele Palladino is a former player of today's opponents: he wore the Juventus shirt in 57 official matches, scoring 10 goals across the 2003/04 season and from 2006/07 to 2007/08. In the Bianconeri youth ranks he won 3 titles: the Viareggio Tournament in 2003 and 2004, and the Primavera Coppa Italia in 2003/04.

Giorgio Scalvini is a lucky charm for Atalanta: his three goals this season have all coincided with Nerazzurri victories. The defender also opened the scoring in both meetings with Lecce and in the match against Roma.

Charles De Ketelaere coming off 2 assists in Lecce vs Atalanta: he had not registered at least 2 assists in the same match since 7 September 2025 in Belgium 6-0 Kazakhstan in World Cup Qualifying; at club level, not since Young Boys 1-6 Atalanta on 26 November 2024 in the Champions League. His last such feat in Serie A dated back to 3 November 2024, in Napoli 0-3 Atalanta.

Charles De Ketelaere is the player with the most passes into the penalty area (87, level with Nicolò Barella) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Teun Koopmeiners is a former player of today's opponents: he made 129 appearances and scored 29 goals in the Nerazzurri shirt between the 2021/22 and 2023/24 seasons, culminating in the Europa League triumph in May 2024. Behind AZ Alkmaar (154), Atalanta is the club with which he has recorded the most appearances in his career.

Manuel Locatelli is the player with the most balls played (2,241) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.



GENOA



SASSUOLO

The two sides have met 10 times in Liguria: Genoa have won five times (most recently 2-1, Serie A 2023/24), there have been three draws (most recently 2-2, Serie A 2021/22) and the Neroverdi have won twice (most recently 1-2, Serie A 2020/21).

Genoa have found the net in 9 of these 10 matches at Marassi against the Emilian side, scoring a total of 16 goals. The only defeat came in the 0-1 result in the 2016/17 league season.

The last time Sassuolo failed to score against Genoa at Marassi was in the 2017/18 season (1-0, Galabinov); since then, the Neroverdi have found the net in six official matches.

Domenico Berardi is the top scorer in matches between Genoa and Sassuolo (at Marassi and the Mapei Stadium) with seven goals.

This marks the first official meeting between Daniele De Rossi and Fabio Grosso.

Following two consecutive defeats without scoring, **Genoa could suffer three straight defeats without scoring a single goal for the first time since 2018 under Ballardini.**

Genoa are the team that have missed the most penalties in the top five European leagues: 4 out of 8 taken.

Facing off are the two most-substituted players in Serie A 2025/26: Lorenzo Colombo and Armand Laurientè (both on 23 occasions).

Lorenzo Colombo, with 6 goals, is Genoa's top scorer in this league. The Italian striker has not scored since the match against Napoli (2-3) on 7 February 2025 and against Juventus he recorded his seventh consecutive game without scoring.

Only Mateo Pellegrino **(5)** has scored more headed goals than Leo Østigård **(4, the same as Lautaro Martinez).**

Only Nico Paz **(63)** has attempted more shots from outside the box than Ruslan Malinovskyi **(43).**

Morten Frentrup (67) is the player in the 2025/26 Serie A season with the most successful tackles.

Arijanet Muric is the goalkeeper who has made the most saves from shots inside the box (76).



PARMA



NAPOLI

The official head-to-head record between the two sides in Parma stands at 24 meetings: 11 Emilian wins (the most recent 2-1, Serie A 2019/20), 5 draws (the most recent 0-0, Serie A 2024/25) and 8 Campanian victories (the most recent 0-2, Serie A 2020/21).

Parma are the 2025/26 Serie A side that concedes the most open-play crosses (19.5 per match).

Parma have gone 5 matchdays without a win: 3 draws and 2 defeats. Their last victory dates back to 22 February 2026 in Milan (Milan 0-1 Parma, Serie A).

Parma are one of 3 sides in the 2025/26 Serie A season with the fewest different goalscorers (10), level with Verona and Torino.

Parma are the 2025/26 Serie A side that has taken the fewest penalties (2, level with Lecce and Cagliari). Napoli, meanwhile, are the side that has conceded the most (8), level with Milan.

Only Inter (27) have earned more points in the second half of the 2025/26 Serie A season than Napoli (26).

Napoli are on a run of 5 consecutive Serie A wins: their last defeat dates back to 22 February 2026 in Bergamo (Atalanta 2-1 Napoli, Serie A).

No side has used more different goalscorers than Napoli (19) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Napoli are the only side in the 2025/26 Serie A season yet to suffer a home defeat.

Napoli have kept a clean sheet for 267 minutes. The last goal they conceded was scored by Siebert on 14 March 2025 (3rd minute, Napoli 2-1 Lecce, Serie A).

This is the 2nd official meeting between Carlos Cuesta and Antonio Conte, following the 0-0 draw in Naples in the first leg.

Matteo Politano is the second most substituted player in Serie A history since 1994/95: he has been taken off early on 200 occasions. The all-time leader is Goran Pandev with 213.

Mateo Pellegrino is the 2025/26 Serie A player with the most headed goals (5).

Mateo Pellegrino is the 2025/26 Serie A player who commits the most fouls (74).



PARMA



NAPOLI

Only Federico Dimarco (87) and Aaron Martin (62) complete more crosses than Emanuele Valeri (56) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Enrico Delprato on the scoresheet against Lazio: the Italian defender's 2nd goal of the campaign. His previous goal dated back to Parma 2-2 Milan (8 November 2025).

Matteo Politano on the scoresheet against Milan: the Azzurri winger's 2nd goal of the campaign. His previous goal dated back to Napoli 2-1 Lecce (14 March 2026).



BOLOGNA



LECCE

The head-to-head record between the two sides in Emilia stands at 24 meetings: 14 Rossoblù wins (the most recent 1-0, Serie A 2024/25), 7 draws (the most recent 0-0, Serie A 2004/05) and 3 Salento victories (the most recent 0-2, Serie A 2011/12).

Lecce have gone 294 minutes without scoring in Bologna: their last goal there was scored by Falco in the 66th minute of Bologna 3-2 Lecce in July 2020, in Serie A.

Bologna are the 2025/26 Serie A side that makes the most substitutions (154 out of 155).

Only Como (23) have scored more left-footed goals than Bologna (22, level with Inter) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

No side has scored fewer second-half goals than Lecce (8) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Lecce are the 2025/26 Serie A side with the fewest goals scored (21) and the fewest shots on target attempted (72).

No side has scored fewer second-half goals than Lecce (8) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Only Fiorentina and Torino (9) have conceded more goals in the opening 15 minutes of the second half than Lecce (8, level with Genoa, Sassuolo and Udinese) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

This is the 7th official meeting between Vincenzo Italiano and Marco Giampaolo: 3 wins for the Rossoblù manager and 3 draws.

No one has hit the woodwork more times than Riccardo Orsolini (5) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

João Mário on the scoresheet against Cremonese: the Portuguese midfielder's 1st Serie A goal. He had not scored in a league match since 17 February 2024 (Porto vs Estrela Amadora, Liga Portugal).

Jonathan Rowe on the scoresheet against Cremonese: his 2nd goal of the campaign and his 2nd in his last 3 Serie A appearances.

No one has won more duels than Tiago Gabriel (199) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Konan N'Dri (21, level with Sarr) is the player who has come off the bench the most times in the 2025/26 Serie A season.



COMO



INTER

The official head-to-head record in Como stands at 22 meetings: 5 Lariani wins (the most recent 1-0, Serie A 1980/81), 6 draws (the most recent 0-0, in the Coppa Italia on 3 March) and 11 Nerazzurri victories (the most recent 0-2, Serie A 2024/25).

In the last 10 Serie A meetings between Como and Inter, the Lariani have never scored and the Nerazzurri have won every time.

Inter's last defeat in Como dates back to the 1985/86 season, a 1-0 win for the home side with Stefano Borgonovo on the scoresheet.

Como have kept a clean sheet for 263 minutes: the last goal they conceded was scored by Donyell Malen from the penalty spot in the 7th minute of Como 2-1 Roma on 15 March.

Como are on a run of 8 consecutive unbeaten matches across Serie A and the Coppa Italia: 5 wins and 3 draws. Their last defeat dates back to 14 February, Fiorentina 2-1 Como, Serie A.

The side with the fewest goals conceded (Como, 22) and the side with the most goals scored (Inter, 71) in the 2025/26 Serie A season meet at the Sinigaglia.

The two sides that score the most goals in the opening 15 minutes of matches go head-to-head: 11 for the Nerazzurri, 10 for the Lariani (level with Napoli).

Only Juventus (526) have attempted more dribbles than Como (469, level with Milan) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Only three sides (Lazio, Milan and Sassuolo) have won fewer duels than Como (940) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Inter are the only side in the 2025/26 Serie A season not to have had a player sent off.

Inter are the 2025/26 Serie A side with the most goals scored from outside the penalty area (10).

Inter are the 2025/26 Serie A side with the most goals scored by substitutes (11).

Inter are the 2025/26 Serie A side that produces the most xG (69.2), ahead of Juventus (61.5) and Atalanta (57.9).

Inter are the side with the most crosses attempted in the 2025/26 Serie A season (897), 147 more than the second-placed side: Juventus (750).



COMO



INTER

Inter have not won away from home since 21 February 2026, a 0-2 victory in Lecce; since then, 2 draws and 1 defeat across Serie A and the Coppa Italia. Inter had not gone this long without an away win since the February-March 2025 period (4 matches on that occasion).

This is the 3rd official meeting between Cesc Fàbregas and Cristian Chivu: across the previous 2 encounters, 1 draw and 1 win for the Nerazzurri head coach.

The three players with the most goals scored from outside the penalty area in the 2025/26 Serie A season will face each other in this match: Hakan Çalhanoğlu (5), Nico Paz (4) and Piotr Zieliński (4).

Maximo Perrone is third for completed passes among midfielders in the 2025/26 Serie A season (1,632), behind Luka Modrić (1,843) and Manuel Locatelli (2,030).

No player has attempted more shots from outside the penalty area than Nico Paz (63) in the 2025/26 Serie A season, with Ruslan Malinovskyi (43) 20 attempts behind, and Hakan Çalhanoğlu (41) completing the podium.

Only Lautaro Martínez has scored more goals than Anastasios Douvikas (11) in the 2025/26 Serie A season. In the 19 occasions he has started from the first minute, the Greek striker has scored 10 goals; his only goal as a substitute came in Como vs Roma on matchday 29.

Lautaro Martínez is the 2025/26 Serie A top scorer (16 goals); the Inter captain is second for xG (13.5) and fourth for shots attempted (85).

No player has registered more assists than Federico Dimarco in the 2025/26 Serie A season (15) – more than double the players in second place: Nicolò Barella, Jesús Rodríguez and Armand Laurienté (7).



FIorentINA



LAZIO

The official head-to-head record between the two sides in Tuscany stands at 82 meetings: 39 Fiorentina wins (the most recent 2-1, Serie A 2024/25), 21 draws (the most recent 1-1, Serie A 2018/19) and 22 Lazio victories (the most recent 0-4, Serie A 2022/23).

Fiorentina are on a run of 4 consecutive unbeaten matches against Lazio (at the Franchi and the Olimpico) in Serie A: 3 wins and 1 draw for the Viola.

Fiorentina have won 2 consecutive home Serie A matches against Lazio at the Franchi (both 2-1): this had not happened since 2007/08 and 2008/09, when they won both by 1-0. To find 3 consecutive home wins, you have to go back to between the 1983/84 and 1989/90 seasons (4 in a row on that occasion).

From the 2015/16 season onwards, among players currently in the Fiorentina and Lazio squads, Albert Gudmundsson is the top scorer in head-to-head clashes (at the Franchi and the Olimpico) with 3 goals.

Fiorentina are on a run of 6 consecutive unbeaten matches across all competitions: 4 wins and 2 draws, with their last defeat being the 3-0 loss in Udine on 2 March. This is the first time in the current season that the Tuscans have gone 6 consecutive matches without defeat.

Fiorentina are the 2025/26 Serie A side that concedes the most goals from outside the penalty area (9).

Fiorentina are the 2025/26 Serie A side that concedes the most goals in the opening 15 minutes of the second half (9, level with Torino).

Lazio are the 2025/26 Serie A side that concedes the fewest goals in the final 15 minutes of matches including stoppage time (4, level with Como).

Only Como and Inter (both 15) have kept more clean sheets than Lazio (14) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Lazio are the 2025/26 Serie A side with the most red cards received (7).

The two sides that concede the most fouls on average in the 2025/26 Serie A season go head-to-head (Fiorentina 16.4 and Lazio second with 15.2).

This is the 2nd official meeting between Paolo Vanoli and Maurizio Sarri: the only previous encounter ended 2-2 in the first leg in Rome, last 7 January.

LAZIO

Only Nico Paz (105) has attempted more shots than Moise Kean (95) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Moise Kean is the player who has been caught offside the most times (30) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Only Kenan Yildiz (135) and Alexis Saelemaekers (102) have attempted more dribbles than Dodò (99) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.
