SERIE A 2025/2026



SASSUOLO



CAGLIARI

There have been 11 official meetings in Emilia: Sassuolo have won three (most recently 1-0 in Serie A 2022/23), there have been six draws (most recently 2-2 in Serie A 2021/22) and Cagliari have won two (most recently 2-0 away in Serie A 2023/24).

Cagliari are winless in their last seven league matches: their last victory came on 31 January (Cagliari-Verona 4-0), followed by two draws and five defeats.

At the Mapei Stadium, the two teams facing off are those that have conceded the most goals in the opening 15 minutes in Serie A 2025/26: 10 for Sassuolo and 8 for Cagliari.

Only Fiorentina and Torino (9) **have conceded more goals than Sassuolo (8) (level with Genoa and Udinese) in the first 15 minutes of the second half in Serie A 2025/26.**

Cagliari are the team that have taken the fewest penalties in Serie A 2025/26 (1).

Cagliari are the team that have received the most yellow cards in Serie A 2025/26 (71).

Cagliari have the best tackle success rate in Serie A 2025/26 (52%).

Only Verona (478) have committed more fouls than Cagliari (452) in Serie A 2025/26.

Only Verona (17) and Pisa (15) **have conceded more goals than Cagliari (11) (level with Fiorentina) in the final 15 minutes of matches, including stoppage time, in Serie A 2025/26.**

It will be the second official meeting between Fabio Grosso and Fabio Pisacane: Sassuolo won the reverse fixture 2-1 in Sardinia.

Only Ylber Ramadani (164) and Filippo Terracciano (158) **have made more interceptions than Jay Idzes (149) in Serie A 2025/26.**

Armand Laurienté is the most frequently substituted player in Serie A 2025/26 (22 times, level with Colombo).



The official head-to-head record in Verona stands at 40 meetings: 13 Verona wins (most recent 1-0, Serie A 2024/25), 11 draws (most recent 1-1, Serie A 2021/22) and 16 Fiorentina victories (most recent 0-3, Serie A 2022/23).

Fiorentina are coming off 2 consecutive Serie A defeats at the Bentegodi: 2-1 in 2023/24 and 1-0 in 2024/25. They have not lost 3 straight away games against Verona in the top flight since 1989: 1-0 on 24 January 1988, 2-1 on 31 December 1988, 1-0 on 10 December 1989.

Moise Kean is the all-time top scorer in Verona vs Fiorentina Serie A clashes at the Bentegodi, with 5 goals (level with Gabriel Omar Batistuta).

Verona have collected just 1 point from their last 7 home Serie A matches: their last home win dates back to 6 December, a 3-1 victory over Atalanta.

Verona are the 2025/26 Serie A side with the fewest points won at home (7).

Verona are the 2025/26 Serie A side with the fewest home wins (1).

Verona are the 2025/26 Serie A side with the most goals conceded at home (23).

Only Verona (2) and Pisa (0) have won fewer away games than Fiorentina (3) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Verona are one of 3 sides in the 2025/26 Serie A season yet to be awarded a red card (along with Torino and Milan).

Verona are the 2025/26 Serie A side with the fewest different goalscorers (10, level with Torino and Parma).

Verona are the 2025/26 Serie A side with the fewest goals scored by substitutes (2, level with Udinese) and the most goals conceded to opposition substitutes (11).

Verona are the 2025/26 Serie A side that drop the most points in the second half compared to half-time standings (-10).

Verona have gone 213 minutes without scoring: their last goal was netted by Kieron Bowie in the 57th minute of Bologna 1-2 Verona on 8 March.

**VERONA****FIorentINA**

Verona are the team that have conceded the most goals in the final 15 minutes, including stoppage time, in Serie A 2025/26 (17). In this ranking, Fiorentina have the third-worst record with 11 goals conceded (level with Cagliari).

Fiorentina are on a run of five consecutive unbeaten matches in all competitions (three wins and two draws), their last defeat being a 3-0 loss away to Udinese on 2 March. It is the first time this season that the Tuscan side have gone five matches without defeat.

It will be the first official meeting between Paolo Sammarco and Paolo Vanoli.

Paolo Vanoli is a former Verona player: he played for the club for three seasons (from 1995/96 to 1997/98), making 89 appearances and scoring 3 goals in official matches, and achieving promotion to Serie A in his first season with the club.

Moise Kean is also a former Verona player: he played there in the 2017/18 season, making 19 Serie A appearances and scoring 4 goals, including two against Fiorentina on 28 January 2018 at the Franchi in a 4-1 win for Verona.

Cher Ndour scored against Inter: it was the Italian midfielder's second goal in this Serie A campaign, marking his best scoring season in a single league campaign.



The official head-to-head record between the two sides in Rome stands at 35 meetings: 21 Biancocelesti wins (the most recent 1-0 in the 2020/21 Serie A season), 10 draws (the most recent 2-2 in last season's Serie A) and 4 Emilian victories (the most recent 2-1 in the 2009/10 Serie A season).

Lazio have scored in 13 consecutive home matches against Parma, netting a total of 27 goals in that run: the last meeting without a Lazio goal dates back to 20 May 2007 (Lazio 0-0 Parma, Serie A).

Two of the 6 lowest-scoring sides in the 2025/26 Serie A season go head-to-head: Lazio (31) and Parma (21, level with Lecce).

Lazio (325) have attempted fewer shots than Parma (332) in the 2025/26 Serie A season. Only 6 sides have attempted fewer efforts than the Biancocelesti this campaign (Verona, Sassuolo, Cagliari, Lecce, Pisa and Cremonese).

At the Olimpico, the two sides facing each other are the 2025/26 Serie A team that has suffered the most red cards (7 - Lazio) and the one that has benefited from the most opposition red cards (7 - Parma).

Lazio are on a 3-match winning run in the league, with the Biancocelesti backline unbeaten for 235 minutes. The last goal conceded was scored by Armand Laurienté in the 35th minute of Lazio 2-1 Sassuolo on 9 March. Lazio had not put together a streak of at least 3 consecutive Serie A wins since November 2024 (5 in a row on that occasion).

Only Lecce (25.26%) register a lower shots-on-target percentage than Parma (25.6%) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Parma are the 2025/26 Serie A side with the fewest different goalscorers (10, level with Torino and Verona).

This is the 2nd official meeting between Maurizio Sarri and Carlos Cuesta: the only previous encounter was won 1-0 by the Lazio manager.

Mario Gila (1,344) is the player with the most balls played in the defensive half in the 2025/26 Serie A season, ahead of Marin Pongračić (1,312) and Alessio Romagnoli (1,296).

Only three players (Manuel Locatelli, Luka Modrić and Jacobo Ramón) have completed more forward passes than Mario Gila (707) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

**LAZIO****PARMA**

Only five players have made more defensive recoveries than Mario Gila (158) in the 2025/26 Serie A season. Of these five, only Evan Ndicka (2279) has played fewer minutes than Mario Gila (2395).

Mateo Pellegrino (467) is the player with the most total duels in the 2025/26 Serie A season, ahead of Lorenzo Colombo (317) and Bryan Cristante (285).

Only Federico Dimarco (271) attempted more crosses than Emanuele Valeri (215) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.



In Cremona, the two sides have faced each other 10 times in official matches: the record stands at 3 wins for the Lombardy side (the last being a 2-1 victory in the 1989/90 Serie A season), 3 draws (the last being a 2-2 draw in the 2005/06 Serie B season) and 4 wins for the Emilia-Romagna side (the last being a 1-5 victory in the 2022/23 Serie A season).

Cremonese have not beaten Bologna at the 'Zini' since a 2-1 win in February 1990 in Serie A: with goals for the Grigiorossi from Dezotti (penalty) and Piccioni, and a goal for the Rossoblù from Waas.

In the three-points era, this is only the fourth Serie A meeting between the two sides. The top scorers in these encounters are Vardy (2) and Orsolini (2), both of whom found the net in the first-leg fixture.

Following their victory in the first-leg fixture, Cremonese could win both Serie A encounters against Bologna for the first time in their history.

Cremonese have not won at home since 7 December (Cremonese 2-0 Lecce): 3 draws and 4 defeats in their subsequent 7 matches in Cremona.

Bologna are the 2025/26 Serie A side making the most substitutions (149 out of 150).

Across all competitions, **Bologna are on a run of six consecutive positive away results** (five wins and one draw). Their last defeat came on 25 January (Genoa 3-2 Bologna, Serie A).

This is the fourth official meeting between Marco Giampaolo and Vincenzo Italiano: the Grigiorossi coach has one win and two draws from their three previous encounters.

Marco Giampaolo won on his debut in charge of Cremonese (Cremonese 0-2 Parma): all three of his most recent Serie A wins, including his time at Lecce in the 2024/25 season, have come without conceding a goal.

Only Arijanet Murić (111) has made more saves than Emil Audero (104) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Only Como (23) **have scored more goals with their left foot than Bologna (21) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.**

Thijs Dallinga scores against Sassuolo: his second goal of the season, leaving him one short of his Serie A record (three in the 2024/25 season).



PISA



TORINO

The head-to-head record between the two sides in Tuscany stands at 9 meetings: 3 Nerazzurri wins (the most recent 2-0, Serie A 1990/91), 4 draws (the most recent 0-0, Serie B 1989/90) and 2 Granata victories (the most recent 0-2, Coppa Italia 1986/87). Pisa vs Torino has not been played at the Arena since 16 December 1990 – a 2-0 home win in Serie A, with goals from Padovano and Piovanelli.

Torino have gone 389 minutes without scoring at the Arena, dating back to 3 September 1986, the day of their last win in Pisa (2-0 in the Coppa Italia, goals from Comi via penalty and Dossena).

Pisa are one of 3 sides in the 2025/26 Serie A season to have been awarded the most penalties (7), along with Genoa and Milan.

The two highest-scoring conceding sides in the 2025/26 Serie A season go head-to-head: Pisa (54) and Torino (53).

Pisa are the 2025/26 Serie A side that wins the most aerial duels (21.3 per match).

Only Cremonese (10.8 per match) concede more shots inside the penalty area in the 2025/26 Serie A season than Pisa (9.8 per match).

Torino are the 2025/26 Serie A side that wins the most total duels (38.9 per match).

Torino are on a run of 6 consecutive away matches without a win across all competitions: 1 draw and 5 defeats. Their last away victory dates back to 13 January (Roma vs Torino, Coppa Italia).

Torino are one of 3 sides in the 2025/26 Serie A season yet to be awarded a red card (along with Verona and Milan).

Torino are the 2025/26 Serie A side with the fewest different goalscorers (10, level with Parma and Verona).

Torino are the 2025/26 Serie A side that concedes the most goals in the opening 15 minutes of the second half (9), level with Fiorentina.

This is the first official meeting between Oscar Hiljemark and Roberto D'Aversa.

Only Tiago Gabriel (129) has won more aerial duels in the 2025/26 Serie A season than Idrissa Touré (124, level with Victor Nelsson).



Giovanni Simeone scores against Milan: his 8th league goal and 2nd in a row for the Torino striker.

Nikola Vlasic scores against Milan: his 7th league goal. The Croatian midfielder hadn't scored since 15 February 2026 (Torino 1-2 Bologna).



INTER



ROMA

The official head-to-head record in Milan between the two sides stands at 110 meetings: 61 Nerazzurri wins (the most recent 1-0, Serie A 2023/24), 30 draws (the most recent 0-0, Serie A 2019/20) and 19 Giallorossi victories (the most recent 0-1, Serie A 2024/25).

Inter are the only side in the 2025/26 Serie A season not to have had a player sent off.

Inter are the 2025/26 Serie A side with the most goals scored by substitutes (11).

Inter have gone 4 official matches without a win: their last victory was a 2-0 home win at San Siro against Genoa in Serie A, on 28 February 2026.

Inter are the 2025/26 Serie A side with the most offensive recoveries (16.8 per match).

Inter are the 2025/26 Serie A side with the most completed crosses (8.5 per match).

Inter are the 2025/26 Serie A side that creates the most chances (13.3 per match).

Inter are the 2025/26 Serie A side with the most clean sheets (15).

Inter are the 2025/26 Serie A side that scores the most goals through substitutes (11).

Roma have not won away from home since 18 January 2026 (Torino 0-2 Roma, Serie A). In their subsequent 6 away fixtures across all competitions, they have recorded 3 draws and 3 defeats.

Roma are the 2025/26 Serie A side that concedes the fewest first-half goals (7).

Roma are the 2025/26 Serie A side that has conceded the fewest penalties (1). Over their last 12 official matches, Roma have kept 3 clean sheets in the 2025/26 Serie A season. In the 9 games in which the Giallorossi have conceded, the total number of goals let in stands at 17.

This is the 3rd official meeting between Cristian Chivu and Gian Piero Gasperini: the Nerazzurri head coach has won both previous encounters.

Cristian Chivu is a former player of today's opponents: he made 124 appearances and scored 6 goals in official matches between 2003/04 and 2006/07, winning the Coppa Italia in 2006/07.

**INTER****ROMA**

Gian Piero Gasperini is today's 'former manager': he managed Inter from July to September 2011, making five official appearances with a record of one draw and four defeats (including the Supercoppa Italiana lost in August in Beijing, and a 1-2 defeat in the derby against Milan). It was against the Nerazzurri that the Roma manager suffered his heaviest defeat as a professional (Inter 7-1 Atalanta, 12/03/17, Serie A).

No one creates more chances than Federico Dimarco (69) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Seasonal goalscoring record for Federico Dimarco (6): surpassing the five goals he scored in 2020/21 at Verona and in 2023/24 at Inter.

Gianluca Mancini is the player in the 2025/26 Serie A season who has received the most yellow cards (9), alongside Juan Jesus, Adam Obert, Ruslan Malinovskyi and Marin Pongracic.

Donyell Malen is the 2025/26 Serie A player who has scored the most goals (7) in the 2026 calendar year, alongside Anastasios Douvikas.



UDINESE



COMO

There have been 14 previous official matches between the two sides in Udine: 7 wins for Juventus (most recent 1-0, Serie A 2025/26), 5 draws (most recent 1-1, Serie B 1994/95) and 2 wins for Como (most recent 0-1, Serie C 1967/68).

Como are on a run of six consecutive positive results in Serie A: their last defeat came on 14 February (Como 1-2 Fiorentina). Since then, they have recorded one draw and five consecutive wins: in all those victories, Como scored at least two goals (an overall average of 2.8 goals per game).

Como are the 2025/26 Serie A side with the most points earned in the second half of the season (24, level with Inter).

Como are the side with the fewest goals conceded (22) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Only Inter (66) have scored more goals than Como (53) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Only Milan and Inter (9) scored more goals from outside the box than Como (8) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Only Pisa (29.38%) has a higher percentage of successful crosses from the final third than Como (29.17%) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Facing each other at the Bluenergy Stadium are the two teams that have completed the fewest long passes in the 2025/26 Serie A season (Udinese 1,705, Como 1,647).

Only Inter (0) have received fewer red cards than Udinese (1, level with Fiorentina and Torino) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Only Milan (65.5%) and Inter (65.7%) have a higher successful dribbling percentage than Udinese (65.18%) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Fourth official meeting between Kosta Runjaic and Cesc Fabregas: in the three previous encounters, there have been only home wins, two for the Spanish manager and one for the Bianconeri coach.

Keinan Davis scores against Genoa: his 10th goal in this league campaign, three in the last five matches. Only Lautaro Martinez (14) and Anastasios Douvikas (11) have scored more goals than the Udinese striker in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

**UDINESE****COMO**

Assane Diao scored against Pisa: his first goal of the season. The Senegalese player had not scored since 19 April 2025 in the Lecce v Como match (0-3).

Anastasios Douvikas on the scoresheet against Pisa: his 11th goal of the season, with 3 goals in his last 5 matches.

Martin Baturina on the scoresheet against Pisa: his 6th goal of the season, with 2 goals in his last 3 matches.

Nico Paz on the scoresheet against Pisa: his 10th goal of the season. The Argentine had not scored since 18/02/2026 (Milan 1-1 Como).



LECCE



ATALANTA

There have been 26 meetings at Lecce: Lecce have won 10 (most recently 2-1 in Serie A 2022/23), there have been nine draws (most recently 2-2 in Serie A 2008/09) and Atalanta have won seven (most recently 4-0 away in Serie A 2025/26).

Lecce are the lowest-scoring team in Serie A 2025/26 (21 goals, level with Parma).

No team has scored fewer goals than Lecce in the second halves of matches in Serie A 2025/26 (8).

It will be the fifth official meeting between Eusebio Di Francesco and Raffaele Palladino: Palladino leads the head-to-head 2 wins to 1, with one draw.

Tiago Gabriel has won more duels than any other player in Serie A 2025/26 (195). The Lecce defender also leads for duels won in the defensive half (156).

Konan N'Dri (20) is the player with the most substitute appearances in Serie A 2025/26.

Only Morten Frendrup (115) has made more tackles than Santiago Pierotti (112) in Serie A 2025/26. Ylber Ramadani (96) and Marten de Roon (90) rank fourth and fifth respectively.

Nikola Krstović is a former Lecce player: the Montenegrin striker made 75 appearances and scored 20 goals for the club between 2023 and 2025.

Marten de Roon is Atalanta's all-time appearance leader: in the match before the break against Verona, the Dutch midfielder made his 436th appearance for the club across all competitions.

No player at Italian clubs has made more appearances or played more minutes in the 2025/26 season than Marco Carnesecchi: 42 matches and 3,280 minutes for the Atalanta goalkeeper across all competitions.

Only Riccardo Orsolini (5) has hit more woodwork than Gianluca Scamacca (3) in Serie A 2025/26.

Davide Zappacosta scored against Verona: it was his second goal of the season (after his first on 9 February vs Cremonese) and the 22nd of his Serie A career.



JUVENTUS



GENOA

There have been 73 meetings in Turin: Juventus have won 56 (most recently 1-0 in Serie A 2024/25), there have been 13 draws (most recently 0-0 in Serie A 2023/24) and Genoa have won four (most recently 1-0 away in Serie A 1990/91).

Juventus are unbeaten in their last 21 home Serie A matches against Genoa: the Rossoblù's last win dates back to 20 January 1991 (0-1, goal by Tomáš Skuhravý). Since then: 16 Juventus wins and 5 draws, with 41 goals scored and 12 conceded.

Juventus are the team against which Genoa have suffered the most defeats in Serie A history (70).

Genoa are without a goal in their last four matches against Juventus (home and away): their last goal was scored by Albert Guðmundsson in Genoa-Juventus 1-1 in the 2023/24 season. Since then, 402 minutes have passed.

Genoa are also without a goal in their last three away matches against Juventus: their last goal in Turin was scored by Gianluca Scamacca in a 3-1 Juventus win on 11 April 2021. Since then, 311 minutes have passed.

Only Napoli (0) have lost fewer home matches than Juventus (1) in Serie A 2025/26.

Juventus are the team with the most home draws in Serie A 2025/26 (6, level with Fiorentina and Cremonese).

Only Inter (39) and Como (31) have scored more home goals than Juventus (30) in Serie A 2025/26.

Since Daniele De Rossi took charge (Matchday 11), Genoa have collected 27 points in 20 matches, ranking 9th over that period.

Since De Rossi's arrival, Genoa have scored 30 goals (level with Roma); only Milan (32), Juventus (38), Como (41) and Inter (42) have scored more.

It will be the first official meeting between Luciano Spalletti and Daniele De Rossi.

Mattia Perin is a former Genoa player: he made 204 appearances for the club across three spells (2010/11, 2013-2018, 2020/21), the team for which he has played the most matches in his career.



Kenan Yıldız scored against Sassuolo: it was the Juventus forward's 10th goal of the season in Serie A 2025/26. He is now the 4th highest-scoring Turkish player in Serie A history, with 19 goals.



NAPOLI



MILAN

The official head-to-head record between the two sides in Naples stands at 87 meetings: 33 Partenopei wins (the most recent 2-1, Serie A 2024/25), 25 draws (the most recent 2-2, Serie A 2023/24) and 29 Rossoneri victories (the most recent 0-4, Serie A 2022/23).

Napoli have won just 1 of their last 6 home Serie A matches against Milan: 2-1 on 30 March 2025. The remaining results consist of 3 defeats and 2 draws.

The recently departed Giuseppe Savoldi remains the all-time top scorer in Napoli vs Milan clashes across all competitions at the Maradona, with 6 goals – level with Marco Van Basten and Diego Armando Maradona.

Since the 2015/16 season, among players currently in the Napoli and Milan squads, Matteo Politano is the top scorer in head-to-head meetings across all competitions (at the Maradona and San Siro combined), with 4 goals.

Napoli kept a clean sheet against Cagliari: it had not happened in 11 official matches, or 8 in Serie A alone (the last being 17 January, Napoli 1-0 Sassuolo).

Napoli are on a run of 4 consecutive Serie A wins: this had not happened since the opening 4 matchdays of the current campaign (Sassuolo 0-2 Napoli, Napoli 1-0 Cagliari, Fiorentina 0-3 Napoli, Napoli 3-2 Pisa).

Only Inter (35) have earned more home points than Napoli (34) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Napoli are the only side in the 2025/26 Serie A season yet to suffer a home defeat.

Only Roma (9) and Como (11) have conceded fewer home goals than Napoli (13, level with Inter) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Only Inter (34) have earned more away points than Milan (32) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Milan are the 2025/26 Serie A side with the fewest goals conceded away from home (10).

Only Inter (27) have scored more away goals than Milan (25) in the 2025/26 Serie A season.

Milan are the 2025/26 Serie A side with the fewest away defeats (1).

**NAPOLI****MILAN**

This is the 12th official meeting between Antonio Conte and Massimiliano Allegri: across the previous 11 encounters, the Napoli head coach has won 6, with 2 draws and 3 victories for the Rossoneri manager.

Scott McTominay scored against Cagliari: it was his 7th goal in this Serie A season, taking him to 19 goals overall in the competition and making him the top Scottish scorer in Serie A history, surpassing Lewis Ferguson (15 goals). The former Manchester United player had not scored in Serie A since 7 February (Genoa-Napoli 2-3). This is his second-best scoring season of his career: only 2024/25 (12 goals, also in Serie A) was better.

Strahinja Pavlović scored against Torino: it was the Serbian defender's 4th goal in this Serie A campaign. He had not scored since 1 March (Cremonese-Milan 0-2). This is now his best scoring season, surpassing the three goals he scored with RB Salzburg in the 2022/23 Austrian Bundesliga.

Adrien Rabiot scored against Torino: it was his 5th goal of the season. He had not scored since 3 February (Bologna-Milan 0-3). This is his second-best Serie A scoring season, matching his five goals in 2023/24 with Juventus; his best remains 2022/23 with eight goals (also with Juventus).

Youssef Fofana scored against Torino: it was his 2nd goal of the season. He had not found the net since 20 September 2025 (Udinese-Milan 0-3).
